Dear School Community,

Welcome to the 2023 school year. Whether you are a returning family or a new family joining our school community, we are so glad to see your children settling into what we hope will be an even better year for all.

Start Up / Bell Times

I remind everyone that we begin each school day with "Get ready for learning time". This is the time between our first bell at 8:50am and the second bell at 9am, when students should enter their classrooms, unpack their bags, and prepare themselves for the day of learning ahead. By the 9am bell all students should be settled in their classrooms ready for learning instructions which commence at 9am sharp.

Please ensure that your child is in their classroom within this 10-minute window, so that they do not miss crucial learning time. Every child that enters a classroom after 9am is not only missing important instructional time but they are potentially also causing disruption to the rest of their class.

Drop Off / Pick Up

It has been wonderful to see more students (and parents) riding to school. However, please be reminded of the following school rules:

- Anyone riding a bike or scooter to school MUST wear a well fitted helmet and be road safe.
- Bikes and scooters should not be ridden on school grounds, instead they should be walked from gates to bike cages and vice versa.

- While we do provide secure and sheltered bike cages, the school does not accept responsibility for damages or losses of bikes or scooters bought onsite by students or parents.

I also remind everyone that reduced speed limits are in place in all school zones. Please ensure we all obey the speed limits, parking restrictions and traffic signals, so we may ensure everyone's safety during drop off and pick up times.

As reported on COMPASS, Yvonne our long-time crossing supervisor decided over the summer holidays to stop working. The Merri-Bek Council are in the process of trying to recruit new crossing supervisors to fulfill the many vacancies across our network, however until then we are not guaranteed a supervisor each day. We encourage everyone to proceed with caution when utilising the crossing on Reynard Street in particular.

Dogs On Grounds

I know that so many families across our school have that additional four-legged family member that often makes the journey to our school for drop off and pick up. Families are welcome to bring their dogs onto school grounds, provided they are kept on a lead, are friendly and are cleaned up after by their owners if needed. I also remind you that not all children (and adults for that matter) are comfortable around dogs, so please be mindful of those around you while on school grounds with your dog.

COVID-19 Updates

As we move into this school year, we are following directives and recommendations from the Department of Education (DET) and Department of Health (DH), to ensure we do what we can to keep everyone safe and healthy. As such please note the following:

- Air purifiers are being used in classrooms throughout Term 1, to ensure good ventilation.
- Rapid Antigen Test Kits are available for collection from the front office if your family require them.
- Face masks are also available at the front office and can be worn by staff, students and visitors. The DH recommends wearing a face mask if you or your child is a close contact.
- Staff and students who are symptomatic should be tested for COVID-19. As such, if your child presents with symptoms, you will be called to collect them early from school.
- If your child should test positive to COVID-19, they should isolate for a minimum of 5 days and not attend school until symptoms have resolved.
- Parents whose child tests positive, should also complete the <u>Student COVID-19 Test Portal</u> online.

ART THERAPY FOR CHILDREN WITH ADDITIONAL NEEDS

Tutor: Kim Waters

Description

This course is designed to engage and enable children to participate in art activities that focus on free expression, group work and self awareness. In Art therapy the emphasis is on participation and the "Doing" or "engaging in the process, rather than aesthetic qualities. We will be expressing emotions via colour and texture using paint, crayon and other art materials of the participant's choice. Group and individual artworks using a range of materials including clay, paint, collage and crayon. there will be an emphasis on the materials and how we feel using them, what we prefer to use and the effects they make.

At the beginning of ech session we will have a brief check in, How are you going today? And an explanation of the activity and then at the end a quick reflection or sharing of Art works if children wish to discuss their work

DRAFT OUTLINE

Week 1- Getting to know me

Outline of what we are doing together, agreement on group outline (rules). Creation of "Me" image using collage, crayon, paint, to express themselves.

Week 2- Getting to know us

Group artwork using paper, pastels, on A3 paper.

Working with others and constructively being part of a group and appreciating their contributions.

Week 3- How am I feeling?

Large body tracing with referral to how we wish to feel. Discussion of emotions and colours.

Week 4- Claytown

Group activity with clay, building a group sculpture that will be photographed and then put back in the bag. Demonstrating that we can do something and then begin again.


Week 5- My mask/me box


