It was wonderful to see so many families onsite last Sunday for our Working Bee. We had children working with their parents across our gardens and lots of new connections were made between families as they worked together. Look out for Sonia's report later in this newsletter. For now, I wish to thank Sonia and her *Buildings, Grounds and Sustainability Group* for organising this day, along with everyone who lent a hand on the day.

## **STAFFING UPDATE**

After several years of delivering a high-quality Performing Arts program to students across our school, Ms Meta is moving on. She has recently accepted a position as a music teacher in a private school and as such will be finishing up here at CWPS on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> March. Please join me in wishing her well and thanking her for all that she has done for students across the years at CWPS.

## **PROGRAM UPDATES**

This year we have been fortunate to be able to maintain our *Tutor Learning Program*, while also establishing some new programs to enhance and support our students' learning.

STEM has been added to our specialist program, with every grade having a weekly lesson for a whole semester with Ms Blatti. STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths, and is a learning experience which allows our students to think creatively and explore a range of challenges as they draw together their learnings from these areas.

CLIP (Challenge Learning & Inquiry Program) is another new program introduced this year and involves small groups of select students coming together to work with Ms Blatti on various challenges and projects over several weeks. These groups will change throughout the year, as will the challenges and opportunities for our students to participate in science and STEM competitions.

MHiPS (Mental Health in Primary Schools) is a new initiative launched and funded by the Department of Education and will be rolling out across the state over the coming years. For CWPS, this funding has enabled us to engage our Mental Health & Wellbeing Leader, Ms Allison. I know that in the short time she has been with us this year, she has already made a difference to so many children and families across our school, by providing support or just a friendly ear. As the year progresses, we will share more about this role.

#### **PORTSEA CAMP**

Last week, I was fortunate enough to join the grade 6 students for three very full days in Portsea. As part of this camp experience, our students had opportunities to kayak, climb the high ropes, play surf life savings games, fly the giant swing, make damper, and learn survival skills. Most importantly, they learnt to be more independent and socialise with their peers and teachers in an alternative setting. I must say, I was most impressed by their behaviour, the care and support they showed one another and the level of cooperation and respect they demonstrated with both our staff and the camp staff. Of course, these opportunities are only made possible for our students, by teachers giving up their personal time with their own families and loved ones, to care for your children while on camp. Please join me in thanking Ms Franco, Mr Aitken, Ms Mardesic, Mr Niciak, Ms Amerena and Mr Krauss.




A huge thank you to our wonderful school community. The images on this page are a snapshot of the new resources the school has received over the last couple of months.

# Coburg West – A commitment to sustainability

This year, Coburg West Primary School has made a strong commitment to embed more sustainable practices in our school operations. Over the next few years, we aim to

- increase the number and diversity of plants and animals in our schoolyard
- reconsider and reduce our energy consumption
- be more mindful of the way in which water is used at the school
- minimise the amount of waste that is created and sent to landfill

We hope to educate our students about environmental issues, empower them to make change, and work with local organisations, council and our incredible parents to further strengthen community connections.

As part of this commitment, we have signed up with the ResourceSmart Schools program. ResourceSmart Schools is an award-winning Victorian Government program run by Sustainability Victoria that assists schools to embed sustainability throughout teaching, learning and the way that schools run. Schools are guided and supported to take action in four key areas: Biodiversity, Waste, Energy and Water. There are set targets and actions for schools to document, which helps to track our school's impact and to identify savings made. We will be working closely with our school facilitator from CERES to ensure that students and staff can reach these goals.

On Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> of March, Miss Blackman and Ms Blatti attended a ResourceSmart Workshop at CERES. The day provided opportunities for us to network with other schools at varying stages of their own sustainability journey and to learn more about how we could implement the program within our own school.

Our Student Sustainability Leaders will be meeting for the first time on Wednesday next week to decide which of the key areas will be our focus for the year. They will work on putting together an action plan of sustainable practices that they would like to see implemented within the school, which will then be shared with students, staff and the wider community. We will have regular updates in the school newsletter to keep everyone up to date with our sustainability journey.


The Grade 3 students have been learning about biodiversity and things we can do to improve the diversity of plants and animals at CWPS. Read on to find out more!!

## Schools for wildlife program with ceres

The schools for wildlife program is a program to work with students to plant an indigenous garden out the front of the school to attract native animals+plants. Ceres is working with the grade 3,s to make our wildlife garden and are donating us all of the plants for our garden for free.

Last week we learnt about endangered species in merry bek like the common brown butterfly and some birds. Then we drew a picture of what we wanted the garden to look like. This week We tested the soil pH to see how acidic and how alkaline it was. Next term grade 3,s and ceres will plant the garden.



## **Biodiversity Audit**

This week half of the grade 3s did a biodiversity audit where We tried to find out how many native plants, birds, insects and shrubs we have so we can improve the school. We went around the school and counted how much native wildlife we could find. We also measured the trees by getting a bamboo like stick. We held it out right in front of us and walked backwards until the tip of the stick looked like it was touching the top of the tree. Then we walked forward in very big steps until you get back to the tree, however many steps it took to get back to the tree, that is how many metres it was tall. If the leaves fall from the trees in autumn they are not native. We found lots of plants but not that many animals. Some things we thought we could do to bring more wildlife to our school are: Bird houses, insect hotel, bird bath, native bird seed and butterfly attracting plants.

Last Sunday 44 parents, carers and teachers and 24 kids came along to make improvements to our school grounds. In total that amounted to an impressive 120 hours' worth of volunteer time!

Lots of effort went into weeding across all areas, contributing the majority of green waste filling up the skip bin. Sand and plant debris was removed from the gutters along the sports field, as well as the gutters of the prep building.

We oiled the existing playground in the big yard, breathing new life into the timber structure. Our good friends from Bunnings Coburg donated a tin of the decking oil. Thank you!

We filled the new garden beds on the south side of the prep, grade 1 and 2 classrooms, getting them ready for future planting. This was a really tough job, and it was impressive how all the helpers persisted until it was done. Thank you so much!

Ms Blackman led the weeding suppression of the front yard, getting this area ready for a planting project to increase biodiversity across the school grounds. #### **HOURS OF OPERATION**

8:00am - 6:00pm

## **VACATION CARE FEES**

\$90:00 per day (Less your Childcare Subsidy)

CWPS Vacation Care Program operates under the Commonwealth Governments Childcare Subsidy Scheme. Please ensure that you are registered with my.gov.au to be able to claim the CCS, otherwise you will be charged full fees. Once your fee statement has been issued, it must be paid 1 week prior to commencement to secure your child's booking.

Preferred method of payment is Direct Debit.

#### **ENROLMENT PROCESS**

To secure a place at the Vacation Care Program you must return your Booking Form with your Child's completed enrolment form.

**PLEASE NOTE**: Current OSHC families are not required to complete new child enrolment form. We only request you complete the booking form stating which days you would like your child to attend.

Your booking will only be confirmed once you receive a confirmation email and fees have been paid.

Vacation Care capacity – 45 students, Educator Child Ratio 1:15

#### **CANCELLATIONS**

We plan our programming, suppliers, and educators in advance, therefore cancellations can only be made if a medical certificate is provided.

#### **MEDICAL CONDITIONS**

The Vacation Care Program requires **Medication**, **Action Plans** and **Risk Minimisation** for any child who has a medical condition including, Anaphylaxis, Asthma, Epilepsy, Diabetes or food allergies.

Daily medication require a completed student medication form.

Your child will be **unable to attend** on the day if the above documentation and medication is not supplied or complete.

## **WHAT TO BRING**

All students are required to bring snacks, lunch, drink bottle and broadbrim hat.

We recommend that children wear suitable clothing for an active day, which means comfortable clothes. Please label all belongings.

The Program will provide a light breakfast (Cereal and toast) and afternoon tea.

Please be mindful we have children with nut allergies.


