Dear School Community,

We have reached the final Newsletter for Term 3. While we have spent much of this school term moving in and out of lockdowns, we must be proud of the efforts of all our students, staff and parent community in keeping our school a safe place. We should also be proud of everyone's efforts to continue our learning, regardless if we are in our classrooms or onscreen.

REMINDERS

I remind all families that in this final week of term, we have a whole staff **Planning Day on Wednesday 15**th **September** and a **Curriculum Day on Friday 17**th **September**.

When learning onsite, we normally schedule a week of alternative timetables at the end of each term, to enable each teaching team to have a day out of their classrooms, enabling them to plan for the term of learning ahead. Given the current circumstances, we will utilise next week's Wellbeing Wednesday as a day for every staff member to meet and plan in their teams. As we have been doing, the students will be provided with a Wellbeing and a Digital Technologies learning task to complete. However, please note that teachers will not be providing feedback throughout this day, as they will be focussed on their planning with their respective teams. For those students registered for Onsite Supervision, Casual Relief Teachers will be onsite to support and supervise those children for the day.

As for Friday, this School Council approved Curriculum Day will proceed, moving to an online format for all staff. As we normally would do for a Curriculum Day, the Out of School Hours Care team have offered a full day of care for any students needing supervision on this day. The school itself, will not be providing onsite supervision, therefore please ensure you contact Gina at OSHC directly to arrange for your children to be booked in for the day if required.

NAPLAN RESULTS ARE IN

Many of you who have children in grades three or five, will be aware that the NAPLAN results have been released. As a school, we are very proud of the results received by every child across our school. We know

that each of them has done their very best on these tests which were spread across three days in May this year.

I urge every parent to assure their child that the results of these tests do not define them as a person. It is important to remember that there are so many talents and skills that each child has, which are not considered by the NAPLAN tests. In support of this idea, I invite you to view and share with your child, a brief animation called *The Testing Camera*.

As per the COMPASS notification, you would be aware that we will be sending home each child's Individual NAPLAN Report once we all return to onsite learning. If any family needs this report before that time, you may collect your child's report from the front office between the hours of 9:30am and 2:30pm. To ensure safety for everyone, we would appreciate a call ahead of your visit, so that it can be ready for you to pick up, and you are asked to utilise the QR Code before you enter the building, wear a face mask and maintain social distances when approaching the office.

PRINCIPAL'S CHALLENGE - INTERNATIONAL DOT DAY

Today (Friday 10th September), Ms Amerena, Mr Niciak, Ms Mardesic, Ms Preston and I attended a full day Literacy Conference online, which was presented by the Australian Literacy Educators' Association (ALEA) and the Australian Centre for the Moving Image (ACMI). We were all very excited to see and hear from Peter and Paul Reynolds, who are twin brothers from Boston. They are both authors, illustrators and animators. Many of our students may be familiar with some of their books such as *The Dot, Ish* or the animation mentioned above *The Testing Camera*.

As part of their work, they support and encourage the development of creativity in children across the world. Over the years, their most popular book *The Dot* has evolved into a world-wide event for children known as International Dot Day. This special event takes place this coming Wednesday 15th September and as such, I challenge all students to get creative and send me a dot!

For inspiration you can view a read aloud of *The Dot* <u>here</u> and then, "make a mark and see where it takes you".

I challenge each student to get creative, make a DOT and send a picture of it through to me at coburg.west.ps@education.vic.gov.au by 4pm on Wednesday 15th September. I will be looking for the most creative Dots to share in upcoming Newsletters & Assemblies. Don't forget to include your name and grade with your entry, as well as writing DOT DAY PRINCIPAL CHALLENGE in the email subject.



There is still time to complete your challenge tasks until the end of term. Looking forward in seeing more challenge tasks over the next week.


