# **Science Talent Search Competition 2021**



This year, 18 students from across the 5/6 cohort participated in the Science Talent Search of Victoria competition.

This year's science theme was: Food: Different by Design. The topic aimed to encourage an interest in science and STEM as well as educate and inspire student's thinking and encourage them to design a range of food solutions. As a group, we brainstormed ideas for our research investigation and came up with the following question as well as guiding questions to help us get started.

# Do plants need soil to grow?

- 1. Why have we chosen this topic? How does it relate to the 2021 theme?
- 2. Who might benefit from this information?
- 3. What do we want to find out? How will we do this?
- 4. What do plants need to grow?
- 5. So that our investigation is a fair test, we need to keep certain things the same. What will we keep the same?
- 6. What will we change?
- 7. What equipment and resources will we need?
- 8. What type of plants are we testing? Herbs? Vegetables? Fruit?
- 9. How will we carry out this investigation? List all the steps we will need to undertake.
- 10. How are we going to record our results?


The students tested growing herbs (parsley and mint basil) in different materials to see which would succeed in keeping the plant alive. They researched which minerals or chemicals were found in each material. The materials we used included: sponges, stones, sand, bark, water and paper. The students completed an experimental research project report which included the aim, hypothesis, method, discussion, data analysis, variables, results and a conclusion. To further extend our learning all students worked in groups and researched why plants require certain things to grow, for example, why do they need light and what is photosynthesis?

The students worked enthusiastically throughout this project and carried out an investigation that further developed their knowledge and understanding of plant growth. For their tremendous effort, all students have been awarded Certificates of Merit for their project work and received medals at our school assembly. What an amazing achievement!




