

#### Languages - Italian: Nadia Di Vincenzo & Marie Petersen

In Term 1 the students are introduced to the study of the Italian language and culture through a variety of activities. activities and games. Participation, staying safe and having fun is always encouraged.


# Performing Arts: Merinda Meta

In term 1, Foundation students engage in music through singing songs and saying chants and rhymes. This is accompanied with fun games and activities, which allow the students to continue practising the skill of singing in tune or rhyming to a beat. There is a strong focus on the concept of beat. Students practise keeping beat on body and hand percussion along to various pieces of music and continue developing this skill throughout the term. Furthermore, students have the opportunity to respond to music through movement activities.

#### Visual Arts: Joan McGregor & Georgia Kyrkilis

In Term One, Foundation students will become familiar with the art room expectations and the importance of safety when working and moving around the Visual Arts classroom. Drawing and exploring Primary colours will be the focus this term. They will begin by drawing a self-portrait and focus on using the elements of line, shape, space and colour to communicate their ideas. Students are then introduced to the primary colours inspired by the works of famous Dutch artist Piet Mondrian. They will explore the use of primary colours and geometric shapes in his artworks and base their designs on this to communicate their interpretations. By creating their artwork, students will practise the skills and techniques required.
