Dear School Community,

Despite the heat on Wednesday, it was great to see so many families attending our Meet the Teacher sessions. We had so many families express their appreciation for the opportunity to meet and chat with their child's teachers.

ALLERGIES

Here at CWPS we have many children and staff across our school with allergies and asthma. We are fortunate that we have our School Nurse Sue to manage their medications and support them when they are unwell. Furthermore, all staff are also trained in anaphylaxis management, including the safe use of EpiPens.

As a school, we are not Nut Free, instead we are NUT AWARE. What this means is that we take precautions across our school to keep everyone safe. While our canteen and OSHC kitchen are nut free, the rest of the school ensures that we take the necessary precautions to keep those around us safe. Whether it be avoiding packing allergens such as nuts in our lunchboxes, washing our hands after eating certain foods or simply being mindful of who around us has allergies, we are educating everyone to be safe.

Your child's teacher may have already advised if there is another child in the class with a particular allergy, if not feel free to check in with the teacher.

WORKING BEE

You may have noticed some works going on around our school grounds with trees trimmed or removed, garden edges being repaired, mounds of mulch being delivered, and the timber playground being cleaned. This is all in preparation for our upcoming Working Bee on Sunday 5th March from 9am. NAPLAN

Classes across grades 3 and 5 have already started preparing for their NAPLAN testing. This year the national testing period has been bought forward from May to March. As such, our teachers have been working with their students to familiarise them with the process and to assist with reducing their levels of anxiety or distress that they may be feeling with these formal assessments. With the NAPLAN test all being delivered online, an important element is developing each students typing/keyboard skills. As we get closer to the date, more information will be provided to those families with children in these year levels.

CWPS VACATION CARE PROGRAM

As was shared in a COMPASS post earlier today, CWPS has been successful in receiving a State Government Grant to establish a Vacation Care Program over the next two years. Therefore, starting with these April School Holidays, our families will be able to access care during the holiday periods from 8am to 6pm each day (excluding public holidays). This will be a wonderful opportunity for our kids to be with their friends, on a familiar site and with familiar staff. More information about the program and booking details will be shared soon.

CWPS Mathematicians- Gender and Disposition addressed!


Historically Mathematics (and science) and related careers has been viewed as fields more suitable to males than females. While there has been some advances over time gender remains a factor impacting on

- Achievement in mathematics
- Attitudes about mathematics and towards oneself as a learner of mathematics
- In participation rates in mathematics once it is no longer compulsory, which impacts future career options and opportunities

According to the Prinsley, Beavis, and Clifford Hordacre (2016, p. 1): Females and people who identify differently represent untapped talent. Enabling them to realise their potential is about both economic growth and social justice.

As part of CWPS Maths program we have introduced activities to address the unconscious gender bias and challenge some of our preconceived ideas about mathematics. This is empowering for all students and staff to challenge their thinking and in turn allows safe, respectful mathematics learning.

Our disposition (what we think about our learning) also greatly affects our learning results. Having a growth mindset (meaning a positive disposition that we can learn anything with effort) allows the student to focus and move forward even when the learning may be difficult. Improvement and growth are very dependent on a positive outlook and the language around learning, for example thinking "I just haven't learnt it YET" is much more effective and powerful than saying "I can't do it." Challenging our thoughts so that we link learning with effort and a positive mindset can really improve individuals learning.



Below is some wonderful work on What is a Mathematician? This allowed some very interesting class discussions. Some grades completed surveys about maths learning and their feelings about mathematics.

All work enabled a positive, respectful mathematics classroom to be set up.

Details on how to book will be sent out before the end of Term One, so look out for details in the newsletter and through COMPASS.



EXCURSION TO CERES

Hi my name is Ella and I am going to tell you about my excursion to CERES.





Firstly, we went to a bush of lemon myrtle with an educator called Tully. As soon as the lemon myrtle touched my tongue I knew I wasn't going to like it. It was too sour and funny on my tongue. The next plant we went to was a succulent called Karkalla also known as Pigface. We held it above our heads and squeezed, and if we were lucky we would get a few drops on our tongue. It tasted okay. But then we went to a bush called River Mint. It had lots of flavour, bad flavour. Even though it was medicine I was never going to eat that stuff again!

Secondly, we had some brainfood and a play in the BEST PLAYGROUND EVER! There was a giant caterpillar that we could go inside of AND on top of the caterpillar. There was also a mountain of tyres that we could go inside of! Inside the mountain of tyres was a swing made of rope.

Thirdly, my class went to a small garden with a shelter. We went with an educator called Subik. He told us all about ochre (a special paint made of rock that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people use) and after that we got to use the ochre to paint on ourselves. We had to paint some of the Aboriginal symbols. These are the symbols I used: Lizard man, waterhole, blood/water,emu, rainbow,possum and snake. Then Subik painted our faces. The girls got three white dots over one eye and then three dots under the other eye and the boys got two red lines across their nose and then six red dots on their forehead. Then we headed back to have a snack.

Fourthly, after we had another play in the playground. Then we headed to a small shed with a lady called Aunty. When we got inside Aunty told us that we were going to act out Tiddalik the frog. There was five animals that we could act out: cockatoo,eel, possum, kangaroo and Tiddalik the frog. I was a possum. The cockatoos would wear wings and masks, the eels wear tails, possums wear tails and furry vests, the kangaroos wear big, bouncy tails and Tiddalik would wear BIG hands and eyes.

Fifthly, then Aunty split us up into three groups. Each group got an aboriginal tool. The tools were: Yidarky (didgeridoo), boomerang, kahnan (digging stick). My group had the kahnan. We got to share information about our tools. One of the facts from mine is that it was only a womans tool. Then we headed back to the courtyard where we were staying.

Next, we started packing our bags and getting ready to get back on the bus. Even though I had no partner, I didn't care because I had two of my best friends in the seats behind me. I couldn't wait to tell everyone about our excursion.

Which I'm doing now!

CWPS Sustainability news

Get ready for your new 4-bin system at home!

A new 120 litre PURPLE lid bin is on its way to all households in the Merri-Bek area from April to May. This is the bin where you put all your glass recyclables from July.

Purple bin for glass recycling - monthly collection

Lids can stay on! Use this bin for:

- All glass drink bottles and jars
- Beer and alcoholic drinks bottles
- Olive oil and condiments glass bottles and jars
- Glass medicine bottles

Yellow bin for mixed recycling - fortnightly collection

All households (if you don't already have one) will receive a new larger 240 litre bin to begin using straight away. Old 120 litre bins can be left on the nature strip and council staff will collect and materials used for making new bins. Use this bin for:

- Plastic milk bottles
- Steel tins
- Paper and cardboard
- Egg cartons
- Steelo wool

Green lid bin food and garden organics - weekly collection

If you don't already have one, you will receive a 120 litre light green lid bin for food scraps and garden waste. Use this bin for:


- All food scraps including meats, fruits and vegetable waste
- Green waste weeds, branches, garden clippings

General rubbish - NO change to general weekly collection of rubbish bin!
