#### **SCHOOL REVIEW**

Last Monday, our School Review began. The Review Panel spent time analysing our progress toward the goals and targets which were set in 2016. They also spent time visiting classrooms across the school. The results from the Parent Forum held on the 21<sup>st</sup> April, were also shared with the Panel.

As part of this process, a Fieldwork Day is being held next Monday 10<sup>th</sup> May. Throughout the day, the Panel will conduct further classroom observations, student and teacher forums, as well as a Parent Forum after school. Our Reviewer would like to chat directly with any parents who are able to attend. This parent session will commence at 3:45pm and will be held in the Small Hall. Staff will be on hand to supervise your children.

#### **NAPLAN WEEK**

Next week also brings the NAPLAN test to all students in Grades 3 and 5. Please check the COMPASS notification regarding the schedule for these tests.

I urge all families to support their children and remind them that it is just a test, like any other. All we ask, is that they keep a positive mindset and remember that this test does not define them. They each have so many other good qualities, abilities and skills that are not tested by NAPLAN.

#### **GROUND WORKS**

During the last term holidays, various works were undertaken across the school. A taller fence and new gate were added to the staff carpark at the rear of the school. Screening was installed at both the east and west end of the upper floor walkways of the Junior Building. Additional concrete was laid by the Bike Cage to provide mud free access.

You may have also noticed that new Garden Boxes are being installed across the courtyard. Our Grounds Keeper Tony, has been busy working on this project to support the Language Teachers who have planted a butterfly garden with their students. While Miss Blackman will be using the others to establish a sustainable vegetable garden with students from the lunch time Garden Club.

#### **CURRICULUM ZOO DAY**

Last Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> April, the staff spent a very busy day learning together with Educators at the Royal Melbourne Zoo. Not only did it provide our staff with a wonderful insight into Zoo life, it also enabled us to work through a problem-solving process in STEM. The purpose of this professional learning is to enable teachers to now implement these concepts and learning processes in the classroom. This will require students to work collaboratively with others to find possible solutions to real world problems.

A huge thank you to our wonderful school community. The images on this page are a snapshot of the new resources the school has received over the last couple of months.





# Important Mathematics Note - Re Prodigy Application and Third-party technologies and compliance with Department policies.

Dear Parents/ Carers,

Students have used the Maths application *Prodigy* and some of our students play Prodigy at home. The following recommendation has been sent from the Department of Education:

"Educational technologies that also have commercial versions may be less secure and often market directly to children.

The risks to schools when they recommend additional technologies was recently highlighted in the case of the third-party mathematics application Prodigy.

In this instance, the application received negative media attention for promoting prolonged engagement with non-learning aspects of the game, rather than developing mathematics learning and understanding.

The 'free' educational version of the game for use at school also has a commercial version for parents and carers, which is directly marketed to them."

Please be aware the school does not suggest or recommend to parents and carers that the home version of Prodigy application be used. There are fewer problems associated with the school version that many of our students have enjoyed using to improve fluency and mathematics facts. As such we do not recommend the use of this application at home.

### **COVID** catch up tutor learning initiative:

This information is for parents, carers and guardians about the Tutor Learning Initiative.

The 2020 school year was an extraordinary and challenging one for every school community.

Many Victorian students spent much of Terms 2 and 3 learning remotely and Victorian schools and their communities made an exceptional effort to provide continuity of teaching and learning to our students during that time.

During Term 4, schools across Victoria were focused on supporting students' mental health and wellbeing, in addition to assisting students to readjust to on-site learning. Teachers also focused on assessing student learning, addressing individual learning gaps and identifying those students who needed extra support for their learning, using classroom-based observation and assessments.

We know that the remote learning experience was different for every student. While some students thrived, some students may not have engaged as fully with remote learning. For most of our students, regular high-quality teaching in 2021 will be enough to help them progress to the expected level of learning. Some students will benefit from additional intensive learning support in 2021

As you may be aware, in response to this, the Victorian Government is investing \$250 million in the Tutor Learning Initiative to enable schools across Victoria to engage teachers as tutors to support students who need extra assistance with their learning. Schools will determine how this initiative is best implemented for their students and will ensure that students will get this support in a way that minimises disruptions to other learning or school activities.

At Coburg West PS, one of our top priorities for the year is to respond to the disruption of 2020 by working to ensure that all students who need additional assistance to 'catch up' on learning that they may have missed, get tailored and targeted help through our new Tutoring Program.

Fiona Currie (Mathematics - Number) and Patricia Amerena (English - Reading) are our tutors this year. Fiona and Patricia will collaborate with classroom teachers to:

- finalise the identification of students requiring additional learning support (based on 2020 student growth) as part of the Initiative, using available data and evidence to understand student learning progress and needs
- analyse the data of the identified students to understand their point of need and develop strategies to support the practice approach adopted by the school in consultation with the relevant classroom teachers
- develop targeted activities for identified students to assist growth in learning
- collaborate with students, classroom teachers, other school staff and families on identifying specific learning goals and on Individual Education Plans (IEPs) where relevant.

Further information about the Covid Catch-Up Tutoring Program and how it will be implemented for students who need individual learning support in our school, will be issued directly to the families of the students who will be targeted for this initiative.






