Dear School Community,

Term One is done and it is hard to believe that the first quarter of our school year is already complete. Congratulations to our grade Prep students who have also completed their first term of school.

CWPS SUPPORT RCH

Earlier this week our school took part in our Switch Up Day. This was a day organised by our Student Leaders, where they asked all students to dress as a staff member, while all staff members were asked to dress as students. This was a fundraiser, with all monies collected being donated to the Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal. In addition, the Student Leaders held a raffle for students to go into the draw to be either Principal or Assistant Principal for a day.

In 2022 CWPS raised a total of \$774.60, while this year we are very proud of our efforts raising a total of \$1,179.80 for the RCH.



ENROLMENT TOURS

This term I began taking enrolment tours for prospective students to join our 2024 Prep cohort. The Department of Education have updated enrolment forms and enrolment timelines for Government Primary Schools and as such we are now able to start distributing and accepting enrolment forms from the start of Term 2.

STAFFING UPDATE

As you would be aware, in recent weeks Ms Meta left our staff to take up a position at another school. Since then, we have been trying to recruit a replacement to take over our Performing Arts program however this has proven very difficult. As you may have heard across the media news, there is a staffing shortage across our state and many schools are struggling to even employee classroom teachers. We will be continuing our recruitment drive, in the hope to engage someone as soon as possible.

SOCIAL MEDIA WARNINGS

While it is an ongoing issue, in recent weeks I have received several complaints from parents regarding their concerns with what is going on online. It appears that many of our students are accessing various apps and online chats, with inappropriate conversations and exchanges taking place. I wish to remind families that many of these apps are not age appropriate for primary school students and by law, they should not be accessing these unless they are of a certain age. Regardless, it is important that any such usage be monitored by parents and carers. Given they are being accessed outside of school hours, the school is not responsible for the exchanges that take place.

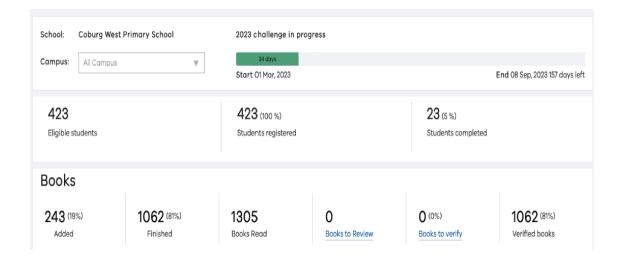

Growing Our Emotional Vocabulary

In Grade 2 this term we have been looking at different ways to grow our emotional vocabulary and intelligence. We have been checking in each day using a class 'feeling wheel'. These are a great way for our students to learn about different emotions.



It is crucial to instill in kids the ability to convey their feelings through language. Naturally, though, it is not always simple for them. They are still learning about their own emotions and coming to terms with some of them.

Children who have a larger emotional vocabulary are better able to recognise and express a variety of emotions, which in turn helps them control their emotions.

Hi everyone, I'm Allison McKenzie, the Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader (MHWL) in the school. I've provided a photo of me so that you can say hello if you see me around the school!

It's been a great start to the year, and I've been meeting lots of wonderful students and parents as part of my role. The role is part of a Department of Education and Murdoch Children's Research Institute Pilot project to improve the mental health of primary

students in schools, also called MHiPS (Mental Health in Primary Schools). My role includes:

- Building staff capacity: assisting teachers with students and giving staff presentations
- Contributing to the wellbeing team: addressing student wellbeing school wide
- Collaborating and coordinating mental health support: liaising with teachers, service providers and leadership to get appropriate support for students.
- Advocating for student voice: ensuring students have a say in wellbeing education.
- Promoting a whole school approach: Uniting staff to create wellbeing processes.
- Research and implement evidence-based strategies: assisting teachers with implementing mental health and wellbeing strategies and collecting data on them.
- Create clear referral pathways: establishing processes for student referral.
- Participate in the Communities of Practice: Liaising with other Mental Health and Wellbeing Leaders in schools.

As you can understand, with all of this to begin, it has been a busy start to the year! Below I've included some great tips for mental health and wellbeing in the holidays and some of the work our students have done for Harmony Day promoting wellbeing and inclusion in the school.

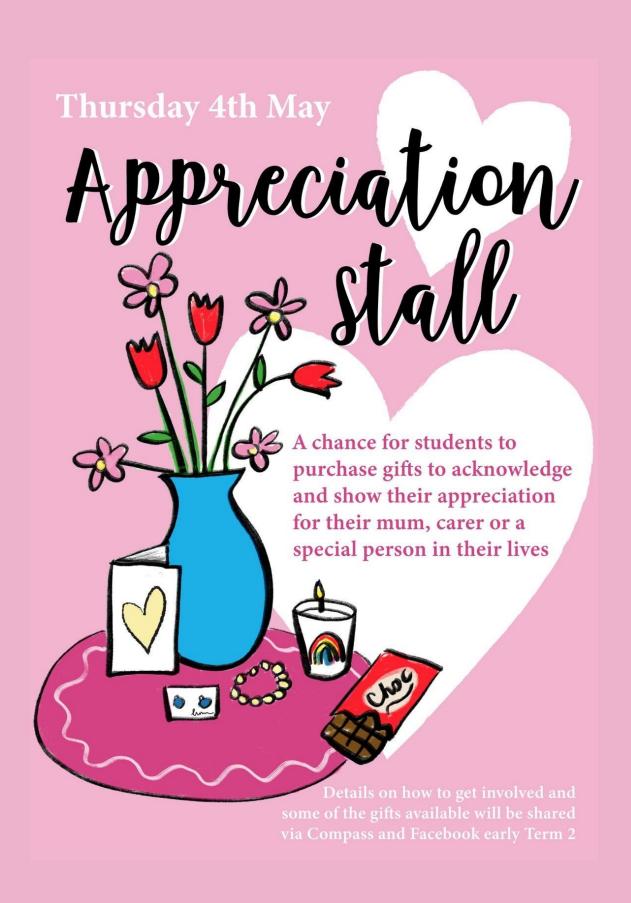

Next Term we'll be launching an incredibly exciting sustainability program in partnership with Aussie zero-waste company **Zero Co.** The program is designed to do two things:

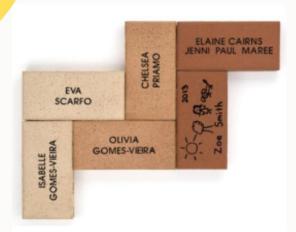
- Raise money for our school.
