#### Dear school community,

It is with great pleasure and relief that we will be welcoming every student from grade Prep to Six, back through the school gates from 9am next Monday 1<sup>st</sup> November.

#### **RETURN TO SCHOOL**

With every student filling our school grounds, hallways and classrooms as of Monday, we need to be mindful of the precautions we are all required to take to ensure that we do not risk a school closure due to exposure to the COVID virus. Some of the measures we are taking and we require you to take, are as follows;

- Face masks are mandated to be worn indoors by all staff, visitors and students from grades 3 to 6. They are also recommended to be worn indoors by students from Prep to 2.
- QR Code check ins are required for any parent, carer, volunteer or visitor entering a school building.
- Parents, carers, volunteers and visitors onsite to meet, help or work, must be fully vaccinated and be able to provide evidence of their vaccination status upon request.
- Ventilation across classrooms will be enabled by keeping doors and windows open, so please ensure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather.
- Morning school drop off will be at school gates between 8:45am and 9am. All teachers will open their classrooms at 8:50am allowing students to be ready for learning to commence at 9am.
- At the end of the day, gates will be opened by 3:20pm for staggered after school pick-ups, starting with;
  - o grades Prep to 2 at 3:20pm from the basketball courts
  - o grade 3/4 at 3:25pm from the courtyard at the Buddy Bench end
  - o grade 5/6 at 3:30pm from the courtyard at the canteen end
- Social distancing and hand sanitising are also strongly recommended.
- If a child is unwell or shows COVID type symptoms, they should be kept at home, likewise if they are unwell at school you will be called to come and collect your child.

In the event of a positive COVID case being identified onsite, the DET and DH have provided detailed guidelines to support schools in the management of a school closure. As such, as soon as a positive case has been identified, the whole school will be closed for a minimum 24-hour period. Here is a brief outline of the process;

- The school community will be advised of the whole school closure.
- Within the 24-hour closure the school will be cleaned.
- The school leadership will identify all Primary Close Contacts of the positive case.
- Communication is delivered to the families of Primary Close Contacts, who will be advised to test and isolate for a period of time as advised by DH.
- Once this is all completed (potentially within the 24-hour period) the school will be re-opened to all staff and students who have not been identified as Primary Close Contacts.

While we are hopeful that we will not find ourselves in this situation, it is pleasing to know that the disruption to our school as a whole, will be brief.

#### **2022 PLANNING**

As you may have already read in my COMPASS email, planning for the 2022 school year is well underway. In support of the work to be undertaken over the next few years to fulfil our School Strategic Plan, there will be a change to our grade structures as of next year. As of 2022, all our grades will shift to straight grades. That is, rather than having composite classes which combine two grade levels, each class will now be made up of one grade level per class. This change will better support teachers to provide highly differentiated teaching programs to a narrower range of learning needs within each class. In turn, students will benefit from more targeted teaching, supporting their ability to achieve better learning outcomes.

Our Tutor Learning Initiative will also receive a boost in 2022, with continued funding by the Department of Education and Training (DET). We will be staffing a fulltime teacher to join Ms Amerena and Ms Currie in delivering the Tutor Learning Initiative. We are hopeful that this will also allow time for the delivery of additional intervention and extension programs to provide learning support to a broader range of students.

At the end of this year, the two years of funding support from DET to continue our Greek Language program, was due to come to an end. As such we were exploring possible alternatives to support our students involved in this program. However, in the last few days, it was confirmed that DET will continue to fund the program into 2022. Therefore, our Greek Language program will be continuing into 2022.

Our staff are currently collating data to develop our student grade placements for 2022. As such, it is important that we have enrolment numbers for 2022 as accurate as possible. Therefore, if you are planning to move your children out of CWPS between now and the start of the new school year, I urge you to notify us in writing as soon as possible. When doing so, I ask that you advise us of the new school your children will be enrolled at, so that our office staff can arrange for the official transfer between schools. Likewise, if you have not yet enrolled your child who is of age to start school, please do so as soon as possible by contacting the office or accessing enrolment information from our school website here.

#### SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS RETURNING TO SCHOOL

Please take the time to read the information provided by Mr Copping which follows in this Newsletter, as it provides advice on how to support children with their return to face-to-face learning. We are aware that for some children, the return to school after this extended lockdown, will be challenging. While as a staff, we will do our utmost to support our students, it is often the case that their true emotions are only shown when they are with their families. If you have any concerns about how your child is coping with the return, please do not hesitate to speak with your child's classroom teacher, who will refer you to a member of leadership if it should be required.

#### **MESSAGE OF THANKS**

On behalf of all staff, I wish to thank everyone for their support and understanding throughout what seemed to be the toughest lockdown yet. I am very proud of our staff's efforts and the community spirit across the board. I know that

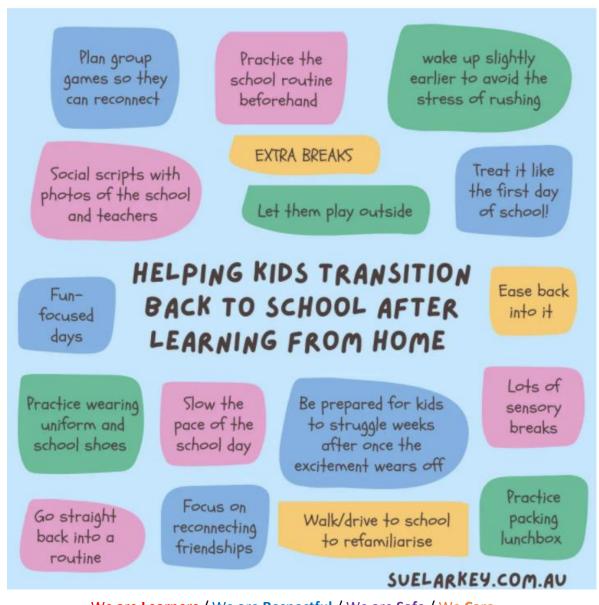
as a Leader, it makes it all seem easier when we are acknowledged for our efforts, as per this recent message from a CWPS parent;

## Practical advice for parents and caregivers relevant for when children and young people go back to face-to-face learning.

#### Start talking

Your child might have worries about the virus, restrictions in place or their education and school. It's important to acknowledge that this is a difficult time. You can explore these and help them to think of ways to manage them using our Time for Us pack or the resources on the Family Links website.

It's important to give them the message that returning to school is a big thing and you understand that. Talk to them in a way that is sensitive to their needs - you will know your child best. Don't intrude or impose yourself on them, but gently open the conversation and let them know you're there for them if they want to talk.

#### Sleep routine

Sleep is very important for your child's mental health and wellbeing, as well as their development. Try and help your child build a healthy sleep routine which they can maintain whether attending school in person or not. Our guide on improving sleep could be a good place to start.

#### Coping strategies

Coping strategies are what you use when feeling stressed, such as speaking with friends or family, doing regular exercise, or using breathing techniques. If you feel comfortable, you could share your own worries and feelings about the current situation and coping strategies you are using to manage these feelings. Acknowledge that it's normal to feel anxious about going back to school - try sharing an example of a time you've felt anxious about going into a new situation.

Encourage them to focus on the present and avoid thinking too far ahead. Thinking too far ahead can feel overwhelming. Focus on what is in their control (hand washing, wearing masks, getting prepared for returning such as packing their bag) rather than what they can't control (what might happen with the pandemic in several months time).

#### Make yourself available as much as possible

Children may want to come and "debrief" but maybe not when you expect. Create space for talking in different ways, such as going on a walk together or baking together - there may be less pressure in these circumstances than when sitting face-to-face. Check in with them periodically. Don't assume they're ok because they seem it. Ask the young person how things are going. Ask them questions like: what have they enjoyed about being back? Any worries or challenges?

#### Look at the positives

It might be helpful to talk with your child about the things they have enjoyed during the pandemic and what they may be looking forward to, like their favourite shop reopening, seeing friends in the park or getting ice cream from their favourite café.

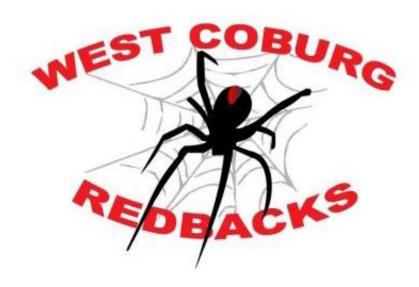
