Dear School Community,

With just two weeks left of classes for this year, there is so much going on across our school. In amongst all the great learning our students are involved in, our staff are planning various events and experiences for our students who have missed out throughout this year.

COVID RESTRICTIONS UPDATE

To ensure we get our school community safely through to the end of this school year, I wish to provide you with the following updates to COVID restrictions;

- Face Masks are mandatory for students in years three to six, staff and visitors in primary schools or
 Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) programs when indoors or social distancing is not possible. Face
 masks are also strongly recommended for students in Prep to grade two while indoors at school or
 at OSHC.
- **Drop off & Pick Up** all parents and carers attending schools, including for drop off and pick up, must adhere to physical distancing, face mask requirements, respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene.
- Vaccination Requirements Parents, cares and other adult visitors nor performing work, who enter school buildings must have had two doses of COVID-19 Vaccines and need to show evidence of vaccination when entering a school building. This includes for the purpose of activities such as school tours, kindergarten transitions, meetings or graduation ceremonies.
- **QR Check Ins** Parents, carers and other adult visitors not performing work who enter school buildings, must check-in using the QR codes.
- **Density Requirements** School events and gatherings which include wider members of the school community (including parents & carers) must align with community settings. All adults attending indoor events on school premises, must show evidence of full vaccination and wear face masks.
- Illness if a child is unwell or has COVID-19 symptoms, they should not attend school until tested and clear of symptoms/illness. Any child who presents to first aid with symptoms, will be isolated and parents/carers will be called to collect the child and take them for a PCR test.
- Exposures any staff or students notified by the school that they are a contact exposed to COVID-19, should immediately seek PCR testing and quarantine until they receive a negative PCR test result regardless of their vaccination status. They must provide evidence of their negative PCR test result to the school prior to returning to school. It is also strongly recommended to complete five days of Rapid Antigen Testing each morning before attending school. If you are living with a person who is a

confirmed case of COVID-19 you will be advised by Department of Health as to your quarantine period (either 7 or 14 days) and testing requirements.

2022 PLANNING

In preparation for the 2022 school year, staff across the school have now completed the placement of students into their future grades. We have also been working on adjusting our structures and processes to prepare for our shift to straight grades next year. The amount of positive feedback from so many parents across our school community has been welcomed, as it reaffirms the need for this shift.

While the bulk of our staffing arrangements have been locked in, we are still in the process of appointing a Language teacher for our Greek program. With Mrs Menikou leaving us to have her baby, we had advertised through the DET's Recruitment Online platform for the standard two-week period. However, we were disappointed to find that there were no applicants. We are now in the process of reaching out to various contacts and organisations to source a teacher for the Greek Language program.

UPDATE ON CLASSROOM UPGRADES

With the Builder Tender due to close this coming week, we are hoping the works to upgrade the classroom spaces in our grade one and two area, will commence through the January holidays. It is hoped that the bulk of the demolition and clearing work can occur through the holidays, to limit the disruption and limit any risks of noise and dust to students and staff.

As such, it does mean that these spaces are currently needing to be cleared. It also means that as we commence the new school year, the grade one and two classes will need to be relocated to other areas of the school. As such, the grade one classes will be located in the small hall, while two of the grade two classes will be located upstairs in the school library, the third grade two class will be located downstairs in the grade Prep area.

While this is not ideal, it is a temporary re-adjustment needed to allow the works to take place. As a staff, we are very excited to see the final result and have these grades move back into their new and fresh classrooms.

SHADE FOR OUTDOOR LEARNING SPACES

Some months ago, I submitted a grant application for shade sails. This grant for up to \$25,000 is to support schools in establishing outdoor learning spaces. They cannot be used on play areas or existing play equipment. As such, I identified two areas of our school yard which could benefit from additional shade and as such, be established as outdoor learning spaces. I was recently advised that the application was accepted and am now awaiting quotations from various companies, which then need to be submitted to complete the process. It is expected that the work to install these shade structures be completed early in 2022.

RETIREMENT

Last week, the staff celebrated the retirement of Mrs Muriel Rogers. Muriel has been a part of the school community for over 47 years. Her connection to the school started when her children were first enrolled, she then went on to become a parent volunteer, who was then employed and became a respected member of staff. Over the years, Muriel has worked in supporting students across our school as an Integrations Aide, as well as helping maintain our school library and assisting in our main office. She was the unofficial school photographer, recording many school events over the decades and meticulously archiving the schools' records. Muriel was a wealth of knowledge when we celebrated our school's centenary in 2017, with a special family contribution to the book which was published to celebrate the centenary.

While it is the end of an era, Muriel's connection to CWPS continues, as her granddaughter is currently enrolled and still has a few more years of schooling ahead of her. It was wonderful to see Muriel's family being joined by many ex work colleagues and friends to celebrate almost five decades of service to the CWPS Community. On behalf of all members of our school community, I wish Muriel well in her retirement and thank her for the many years of dedicated service to our school.

With just two weeks of the 2021 school year remaining, I trust we will all continue to be kind and respectful.

Christmas on the Streets is a not-for-profit organisation supporting men and women experiencing homelessness.

COTS is a movement which offers companionship, food, clothing, sanitary products, gifts and essential items to individuals and communities that are in need. The COTS movement strives towards breaking the stigma surrounding those who have found themselves in unfortunate circumstances and reminds whoever they encounter that they are unconditionally loved, important and worthy.

Each family will be asked to donate one item to their class category.

Boxes will be provided in each classroom for students where students put their donations.

- 5/6 families will be asked to donate personal hygiene items e.g. soap, shampoo, toothpaste, hand sanitizer, deodorant, sanitary products etc.
- 3/4 families will be asked to donate tinned products e.g. vegetables, fruit, grains, soup, beans, fish etc.
- 1/2 families will be asked to donated packet products e.g. pasta, crackers, energy bars, pretzels, noodles
- Foundation families are asked to donate jars and treats e.g. vegemite, peanut butter, jam, cookies, chocolate, after dinner mints, etc.

Our charity drive began on Monday 29th November and will run for 2 weeks.

It will end on **Friday 10th December** with a **comfy clothes** or dress up celebration day. On this day we ask students to <u>bring a gold coin donation</u>. This money will go towards buying things like socks and T-shirts to complement our other donations.

Humans have better depth perception when they have both eyes open. Lola M 5/6B


There are lots of constellations and each have their own names including the Southern Cross. Yannic B 5/6J


