We need to remember that each of these tests are only a snapshot of an hour in each child's life of learning. There are so many factors to consider and so many other qualities and skills that our children possess that are not reflected in these tests. We are very proud of their efforts.

#### **OPEN DAY**

You will find information and learn about:




Please note all volunteers who wish to work in the Canteen must have a current Working With Children Check which is available at: Working with Children Check (service.vic.gov.au)


