# Italian - Grade 5 & 6 Pasta Making Activity



This week in Italian we participated in a fun pasta making activity.

We learned how to make pasta from scratch. We went into the OSCH

(Out of School Hours) building and got into groups of four.

We started by watching a demonstration from Mrs Di Vincenzo and Mrs Petersen on how to make the dough. First, we put una tazza di farina (one cup of flour) and un uovo (one egg). Then we kneaded the dough by pressing it in the palm of our hand, and slowly adding in un po d'acqua (a little bit of water). Next we rolled it through the pasta machine a few times until it was thin. Then we threaded it through the machine to shape the pasta into fettuccine or spaghetti. We then placed the pasta in a zip-lock bag and added a pinch of flour so the strands did not stick.





The pasta was then ready to be taken home and cooked. We are all so excited to take the pasta home and add our own favourite sauces. We all very much enjoyed this pasta making activity. A big thank you to the parents Sabrina (Alessio A's mum), Peter (Eric B's dad), Karen (Maudie A's mum) and Josephine (Rose and Lucy B's grandmother), but most of all Mrs Di Vincenzo and Mrs Petersen for organising this super fun activity.

# Tram network upgrade

Stage Two - Melville Road, between Cumming Street, Brunswick West and Braemar Street, Pascoe Vale South

August 2023 Update 3

Department of Transport and Planning (DTP) and Yarra Trams regularly carry out maintenance and renewal work across the tram network to improve operations and passenger experience. We have replaced the tram tracks on Melville Road, between Fitzgibbon Avenue and Albion Street during Stage One of our works. We thank the community for their patience while we made the tram network safer.

Stage Two works are continuing. Melville Road, between Cumming and Braemar streets will continue to have disruptions until 19 September, including a full road closure.

New information – We are installing underground cables at the intersection of Reynard Street and Melville Road. See the last page for more information.
