In recent weeks, we have had many opportunities to celebrate the learning and efforts of students across our school. Many of you would have seen the Art Exhibition and heard the Choir at our Twilight Market, attended the Fashion Parade delivered by our Italian Language students (see the newspaper article following in this Newsletter) or visited the Grade One classrooms to listen to our students share their research projects. We are proud of the many and varied learning experiences we provide our students here at CWPS, but we are also proud of the efforts that go on behind the scenes.

Within this last fortnight, myself and the Leadership team met with our Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) from Regional Office, to review and evaluate our Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) for 2022. I am proud to say that our school performed very well, and it was found that we are progressing nicely towards achieving the targets in our four-year School Strategic Plan (SSP). This was attributed to the work being done by all staff who meet weekly in their Professional Learning Communities (PLC) to review and track students' progress data. Combined with the leadership and support of our Leading Teachers who guide, mentor and coach all staff to ensure we maintain a consistent teaching approach across our school and provide a differentiated curriculum. It was also noted by our SEIL that the data demonstrates how this has been an upward trend since 2017. So, I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank our whole staff, along with our Leadership Team for their efforts and dedication to improving student learning outcomes across our school.

Tuesday 15th November:



I ragazzi sono incoraggiati ad acquisire competenze linguistiche attraverso esperienze di apprendimento culturale

significative e autentiche.

L'Italia ha una ricca storia culturale: il suo stile di vita, l'arte, il cibo, la moda, gli eventi sportivi, la storia e l'architettura creano un arazzo ricco e colorato per coinvolgere i bambini nell'apprendimento dell'italiano come seconda lingua.

L'influenza dell'Italia è visibile ovunque oggi in Australia, dove quasi un milione di australiani ha origini italiane.

Il Victoria ha una grande comunità di origine italiana e ci sono molti ristoranti, negozi e comunità che offrono agli studenti della Coburg West Primary School meravigliose opportunità di sperimentare la cultura italiana e di esercitarsi a parlare la lingua, incoraggiandoli a fare confronti tra le lingue e le culture italiana e australiana.




