While it can be a busy day, full of activity, it also proves to be a very social day. Many friendships are formed and connections made between parents. #### **CLASSROOM UPGRADES ONTRACK**

If you take a peek into the Grade 1 classrooms, you will see that the upgrade works are almost done. New walls are up, new floor coverings down, acoustic panelling on the walls and a vibrant new colour scheme liven up these spaces.

While there have been a few hiccups and delays along the way, we are still on track to make handover by the end of this term. As such, we should be able to have all our Grade 1 and 2 students back into their proper classroom spaces for the start of Term 2.

#### **END OF TERM EARLY DISMISSAL**

I remind everyone that with the end of Term 1 next week, students will be dismissed at 2:30pm on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> April. Please ensure you are able to pick up your children at this earlier time or consider making other arrangements such as a booking at OSHC.

#### **STAFFING & GREEK LANGUAGE TEACHER**

As previously reported, we have been struggling throughout this term to have teachers replaced when they are absent. Unfortunately, as we keep hearing in the news of late, employing or maintaining adequate staffing levels is a problem across many industries. As a result, we have had to split grades for the day, cancel specialist programs or shuffle classes between leadership staff. While I did enjoy taking PE classes, this is not an ideal situation and we are trying to manage as best we can to keep the school running smoothly.

We are also hopeful that with this third attempt of advertising for our Greek Language Teacher vacancy, we may be lucky enough to receive at least one application this time around. In the previous two attempts, we had no applicants and as such, we are trying for a third time. If all goes well, we aim to have a teacher employed for the start of Term 2.

#### **COVID SAFE REQUIREMENTS**

As this term progressed, we have considered ourselves to be very lucky that we have not suffered a major COVID outbreak across our school. While we continue to have positive cases reported daily, our numbers are small in comparison to some schools. I am confident that this is thanks to the measures taken by the majority across our school. Thanks to the use of face masks, hand hygiene, air purifiers, twice weekly Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT), ventilation and vaccinations, we are doing considerably well.

While we have yet to be advised by the Department of Education if any of the restrictions will be eased or changed, we must continue with these current arrangements. In recent days, we have received delivery of 20 additional Air Purifiers to support ventilation through the winter months, additional supplies of RAT Kits and children's face masks. This may indicate that some of the existing measures will be continued into Term 2.

#### PARENT HELPERS RETURN TO OUR CLASSROOMS

We are also planning to have our Parent Helpers Program start up again in Term 2. Thank you to those parents who attended the information session held in the last fortnight with Ms Amerena. Your child's teachers will provide more information regarding when help is required and how to roster yourself on to help. Of course, you will still be required to follow any COVID Safe measures that may be in place at the time.

#### **COLOURFUL CLOTHES DAY**

Our Student Leaders are very excited to be running their first major activity for this year. Next Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> April will be our Colourful Clothes Day, where all students are asked to wear their most colourful clothes to school and make a gold coin donation. All funds raised on the day will be generously donated to the Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal. This appeal was chosen by our Student Leaders given their connection to the hospital via personal experience or the experience of a friend or family member. We look forward to seeing everyone taking part in the colourful fun of this day.

Before the term ends, please take the time across the week to show your appreciation and thank your child's teachers for the hard work and great efforts they put in everyday to keep your child safe, engaged in their learning and helping shape them into the good citizens our world needs.

If I do not get the opportunity to do so personally at the gate, I would like to wish you all a restful and safe holiday, with a Happy Easter in the middle.

She admitted she wasn't that into swimming until her mum sat her down after stealing her sister, Bronte's, trophies and medals. She realised then she really wanted to swim and have medals like Bronte. She also said that be humble when you win because her sister Bronte wasn't and she created her greatest rival. It was very interesting.

The last speaker we had was Damien Fleming. He is a retired cricketer and now commentates during matches. He talked to us about how you need a plan to achieve your goals. He showed us what happened in a semi-final game Australia versus South Africa. He showed us how he had to adapt to the situation when their game plan appeared to be failing. He showed us how not only is it important to have a plan, but a back-up plan. You also have to be ready to adapt to an unexpected situation. Because of Damien Fleming's adaptation to the situation, Australia got through to the Grand Final.

Overall, we all had a great day. We learnt how to become a good leader and learnt tips about everyday life. We really enjoyed all the speeches and activities there were and in the end it was a fun, memorable day and trip.

# **Winning Artwork**


This week at Coburg West, Grade 6 student Sophia Huang impressed the community with announcements of her success in the art world.
