#### NAPLAN ONLINE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED

I must thank Mr Copping, the teachers and students for all their hard work and efforts in getting all NAPLAN testing completed successfully. With this year being the first time CWPS students completed these tests online, there was a lot of concern around how it would all go. But thanks to all the organisational efforts of Mr Copping, support and calm delivery by all teachers in Grades 3 and 5, the students breezed through the four tests without any major issues. Congratulations to all the students for giving it a go and doing their best.

#### **COVID SAFE MEASURES UPDATE**

A reminder to all families, that as per updates from the Department of Health and Department of Education, we will be continuing to distribute Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) Kits to all students and staff. While it is no longer a requirement to test twice weekly, it is still an expectation that students and staff take a RAT if they have symptoms or daily if they are a close contact of a positive case. Of course, if a positive result is shown, the positive person must stay home and isolate, notify the school in writing or phone as soon as possible and follow the necessary health advice.

As we have already seen this term, many students and staff are also being heavily impacted by colds and influenza. I urge all families to consider keeping their children at home while they are unwell or have symptoms such as fever, coughing, sneezing or a runny nose.

- 2023 Enrolments are open. If your child is of age to commence school next year, please contact or visit the
  office to collect an enrolment pack. If you know of a friend, neighbour or relative within our school zone who
  also have a child ready for school in 2023, have them contact the office to arrange a personalised tour of the
  school.
- 2022 Parent Payments/Essential Learning Items are now called Voluntary Financial Contributions/Curriculum
   Contributions. These contributions cover the costs of your child's learning and wellbeing, for example all
   stationary items used in class and specialist classes, as well as providing the services of our (busiest staff
   member) School Nurse. These contributions can still be made via COMPASS, with more information available
   on our website at Parent Payments.
- <u>EOFY Tax Deductible Donations can be made</u> to either our Building Fund or Library Fund. These donations can also be made via COMPASS, with the office staff issuing receipts for all donations made. All monies raised in these funds, have contributed to such things as new carpets and floorings across all Prep, Grade 1 and 2 classrooms, along with hundreds of books being purchased to build reading collections across our school.
- <u>Students not required on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> June</u> as this will be a whole staff Professional Practice Day (PPD). Please see OSHC for information regarding the care program on offer for this day if required.



# The Power of Writing

Have you ever wondered, 'how can I make a difference in the world?' One of our students, Alex in 3S thought this same thing but decided to do something about it. He wanted to be heard and thought that the best action was to write to our Federal Member for Wills, Peter Khalil. This is what he wrote:

Dear Sir,

I am a boy, but I care about women not getting paid equally as men. It is not respectful for women to be paid less than men. Women work just as hard as men, and they still get paid less even though some of them work in important jobs like health care.

An example is I saw girls help an older man on the tram that fell over, and they took very good care of him, and they should be paid equal to men.

When girls grow up (for example when they are teenagers) they still get paid less than boys in the same job. This is not right.

Can you fix this problem?

Thank you for listening to this important problem.

In response to this communication, the Federal Minister for Wills responded below:

Hi Alex,

Thank you for your email on the gender pay gap. Federal Labor and I, like you, are concerned about the gender pay gap and if elected, will work to eliminate this pay gap.

A Federal Labor Government will lead a national push to help close the gender pay gap. A Federal Labor Government will do this by:

- Legislating so companies with more than 250 employees will have to report their gender pay gap publicly.
- Prohibiting pay secrecy clauses and give employees the right to disclose their pay, if they want to.
- Taking action to address the gender pay gap in the Australian Public Service.
- Strengthening the ability and capacity of the Fair Work Commission to order pay increases for workers in low paid, female dominated industries.

One sector which is female dominated and where staff are in need of a pay rise is the aged care sector. Women make up the overwhelming majority of workers in the aged care sector and they are in need of a pay rise. A Federal Labor Government will support workers' calls for better pay at the Fair Work Commission. And a Labor Government will fund the outcome of this case. Because if we want higher standards of care – we need to support higher wages for our carers.

Thank you both again for your advocate on this important matters. It's great to see young people getting involved and pushing for positive change! Please don't hesitate to reach out if I can be of assistance on any other federal matters.


This is the power that each of us has to help change the world and it definitely can have an impact at a young age.


