

CWPS @ TOURNAMENT OF THE MINDS

On Saturday the 20th of August a group of 21 students went to La Trobe University in Bundoora for a tournament. The tournament was called Tournament of the Minds and there were four different challenges including: STEM (Science Technology Engineering Maths), Language Literature, Social Science and The Arts. We had three groups each containing several students from grade 5 or 6. On the day we had to present our Long-Term Challenge which we had been working on for 6 weeks during lunchtimes at school. We had to solve these challenges as a team with no help from teachers or parents.

The Language-Literature challenge had to pick three antagonists from well-known stories from different genres of texts and present their side of the story. The STEM groups challenge was to make a platform that moves at two different speeds to display a 300g gold nugget and write a brief history of gold. Our Language-Literature team consisting of Willa, Isla, Cedar, Mila, Ashleigh H, Estelle and Lia chose Cruella De Ville, The White Witch, and the Evil Queen. They did an amazing job and came second overall in their division. Groups 2 consisting of Freya, Sabine, Giulia, Priscilla, Katherine, Nina, and Amelia and Group 3 consisting of Olivia T, Massimo L, Leo, Christian, Guy, William W and Charlie completed the STEM challenge. Both teams did an amazing job with group 2 coming runners up to our very own team 3.

This now means that group 3 will be going on to the State Finals on Sunday September 11!

We all enjoyed it and thought it was a fun new learning opportunity.

We hope that this will encourage all students to consider borrowing and perhaps explore a different genre to expand their reading experience.












Celebrating Great Maths at Coburg West!

Congratulations to William in Grade 3R for entering the 2022 Maths Talent Quest.



He was inspired to create this project, after attending the Grade 6 Market Day and seeing how successful it was. William shared his business plans and his sophisticated Excel spreadsheet to our School Leaders, that included the business' revenue expectations, profit and loss statements, expenses, ratio analysis and best buys. He learnt how to use formulae in Excel to calculate these elements and included variables such as probability, to set up an exciting business that involves chance and prizes that could be won. We are so proud of all his extra efforts and that William could share his Mathematical understandings with detail and confidence. 


2022 PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

As we will start the assembly at 2:30pm, we will send students back to their classrooms to pack their bags. This will mean that students can then be collected


from their normal dismissal spaces instead of being dismissed from the large hall.




