This conference is a highlight of the year for languages education in England and attracts hundreds of delegates each day from across all sectors of education including primary and secondary schools as well as universities.

Marie gave a practical presentation of her experiences in planning, designing and implementing CLIL units of work at Coburg West Primary. She outlined the resources and strategies that were used as part of the introduction of CLIL in our school and demonstrated the impact this had on student engagement and learning. It received positive feedback from many of the 500 delegates in attendance.


