STATES OF MATTER INCURSION

On Monday the 21st of November all the year 4's had an incursion about 'States of Matter'. Activities:



We did lots of fun activities, including making a crystal forest. We had a cup of water and a special salt called epsom salt. We put a pinch of epsom salt into the water, left it for about 30 minutes and then it turned out like this.



We also made lava lamps using a plastic bottle with oil on the top of water with red food dye at the bottom. We put a tablet or pill in, which went to the bottom. Bubbles shot up then got stuck on the oil and came down.

We did a race against different types of liquids like dishwasher detergent and dye. Next we put a type of metal and wax in a plastic container and then put it in boiling water in to see which one melted The wax didn't melt but the metal did.



The final activity was my personal favourite bouncy balls!

We used a special crystal powder that we put into a special mould. The bouncy balls really worked.

Science Talent Search 2022

This year twenty two of our Grade 3-6 students participated in the Science Talent Search (STS) program organised by Science Victoria. The aim of the program is to stimulate an ongoing interest in the study of sciences while encouraging independent, self-motivated project work by students. Participating students are grouped into junior, middle and upper primary sections. There are many options for how students can present their entries including working models, wallcharts/posters, and scientific photos - just to name a few!

Our students completed a class project which incorporated the STEM design process. The investigation was based on bridge building. The students worked individually and in groups to research the different types of bridges, then design their models, build their prototypes and finally test and evaluate their designs.

These were our guiding research questions:

What forces act on a bridge?

What are the three loads that need to be considered when designing a bridge?

What are some of the different types of bridges?

Explain tension and compression - What do they have to do with bridges?

Which shapes and designs are the strongest?

How can bridges be built to deal with weather and other wear?

What is your hypothesis for each bridge you will build? Which material and shape will work the best?

The results: Our grade 3 / 4 students won a Bursary Award and medals and our year 5/6 students attained a Merit Award and medals. Congratulations to all our students for their fantastic effort. And a special thank you to the students that represented our school on judging day!


