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# GRADE 6 ECONOMICS EXCURSION

We looked at the Melbourne Coat of Arms -which had a bull, a sheep, a whale, and a ship, for meat, wool, fishing and shipping, the main industries of Melbourne at the time. We also tried a native plant could tried pig face, it didn't taste very good.

After that we left Fed Square and went to an Hosier Lane, filled with street art but used to be a lot of clothing factories. Next we headed to a fancy office which smelt like ham & cheese toasties. We were all super hungry!

Finally, we went to an alleyway where we played two-up, which is illegal on every day but Anzac Day. This is because two-up was the only game the soldiers could play while sitting in the trenches.

We each got a souvenir which was a half penny.
