Dear School Community,

Mr Copping and I would like to say thank you to all those who assisted in making this Principal's Day a special one. We were inundated with kind greetings, well wishes and lots of special cards, drawings and poems, all of which made our day.

STAFFING UPDATES

As of Monday 14th August, I will be on Long Service Leave through to the end of term. In my absence, Mr Copping will be Acting Principal and Ms Amerena will be stepping up as Acting Assistant Principal. I am sure they will both ensure that our school continues to move along smoothly as I visit parts of Europe.

In addition, our Groundskeeper Tony is also on leave as of Monday 7th August. In his absence, we have Julian who will spend time in our school each Monday, Tuesday and Thursday to assist in caring for our school grounds until Tony's return in mid-September.

SEWER PROBLEMS & ROOF REPAIRS

For those of you that are not yet aware, we have had some major problems with our toilets over the past week. Last Thursday morning we found that the student and staff toilets along the eastern side of our school had flooded. Given we have also had ongoing issues with toilets not flushing properly and blocking, I lodged an Emergency Maintenance call to the Department. Temporary toilets have been delivered and a team of plumbers have been in to investigate. They found that the main sewer trap on the school boundary has collapsed causing the blockage. Major repair works we are Learners, we are kespectrul, we are Safe, we care

are now being planned but it will mean areas of our front playground will be closed off to students and the portable toilets will be in use until all the works are complete.

Also in the coming months, works will begin on repairs to part of the roof on the eastern tower, along with reinstatement works to a wall in 6F and the storeroom above it.

PARENT OPINION SURVEY

As of Monday, our parents/carers will have the opportunity to provide their feedback about our school. This annual survey offered by the Department of Education is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. While the survey is optional, I encourage all families to participate. Our school will utilise the results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. An email will be sent to all families via COMPASS containing the link and code for families to access and complete the online survey. It should only take 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed on a desktop computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone at any time within the survey period. This survey will be open from Monday 7 August to Friday 8 September 2023.

2024 ENROLMENTS NOW BEING FINALISED

In accordance with the Department of Education's timeline for enrolments, we are now in the process of finalising enrolments for the 2024 school year. In the past week I have sent out letters of offer to families of future Prep students and have submitted indicative enrolment numbers to the DE. If you or someone you know has a child of age to start school next year, please contact the office to arrange enrolment as soon as possible.

TRAM WORKS ALONG MELVILLE ROAD

We have been advised that over the coming months, tram line works along Melville Road may impact how our students travel to and from school. Road closures and diversions will result in changes to traffic flow and lead to additional congestion in surrounding streets, particularly through drop off and pick up times. We have also been advised that there will be buses replacing tram services and crossings may be affected, as such families may need to allow extra time to walk, cycle or drive to school. Please note the materials being dropped in your letterboxes which provide greater detail to residents.

COMPASS WHEN ON HOLIDAYS

With us having the freedom to travel once again, it is wonderful to hear of so many families taking opportunities to go on holidays. If your child will be travelling through the school term, please ensure that you inform the school in writing via email and most importantly that you enter your child's absence on COMPASS as a family holiday.






2023 PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

WRITING FOR WELLBEING IN GRADE 3

To start off Term 3, the Grade 3's have been exploring help-seeking strategies through the Education Department's Resilience, Rights & Respectful Relationships program. This program contains many engaging activities that teach a



broad range of elements within the social and emotional curriculum and I am pleased to share the latest chapter in our journey. The Grade 3 cohort had the opportunity to explore the value of seeking and offering help, culminating in the creation of unique picture story books with strong messages for our Prep students. These books not only kindled creativity but also served as vessels of understanding and compassion, bridging the gap between different age groups within our school community.

Below, Lux and Tayla from 3R beautifully articulate the writing stages throughout this learning and reflect on their understanding of leadership.

In writing\wellbeing we made picture story books. We needed to write eight pages that were based on a character having a problem at school that maybe a prep would face.

First, we brainstormed problems that a prep might face at school and how they would react to the problem negatively and positively.

Next, we planned our ideas we each liked the most onto a story mountain. The first thing that was on the story mountain was about introducing the character. Then we planned their bad experience, how they reacted to it, and how their negative reactions made the problem bigger or didn't solve it. For our endings we had to brainstorm good advice the character got from someone and how they used it. Then they would end up with their problem solved and how their body felt afterwards.

Once we finished our draft and publishing, we printed it out and illustrated. One thing I enjoyed about this was probably showing the preps and sharing it. - Tayla (3R)





In wellbeing\ writing the grade 3s made picture story books for the preps. I wanted to talk about how I was influenced by my little sister, Una.

Una was having trouble finding friends to play with, and that was the problem in my story. Una the Kookaburra was looking for someone to play with. That was what happened in real life. This was the second phase. Una asked Connie the Cockatoo, but she said: "You're too boring to play with!" And just like in the story, the same thing happened to Una. People had been saying she couldn't play with them, and she was really sad, and affected at home. In the story, she ran to a playground and hid in a tunnel, crying. This was probably what Una felt like doing. Then, Maggie came and told Una to stand up for herself, she did, and she played with Maggie. This was representing my incredible friends, **Tayla and Remy**, who helped my sister, and I would like to say thank you.

When **MOST** people had finished, we shared our stories with the preps and ate lunch with them. This was to build confidence, by speaking and making relationships with people who might be a bit scary to them. In the end, we had made a tiny but special difference for the preps, who now feel a little bit more comfortable speaking to people. I think it also helped us a little, because even though they're younger or smaller than us, most of the time speaking to anybody who you're not too familiar with can be scary to talk to.






