Dear School Community,

We have now reached the middle of Term 1 and everyone has settled into their learning with ease. Our Prep students are now attending fulltime and they have impressed everyone with how quickly they have adjusted and settled into classroom routines and learning.

COVID Safe Measures

I remind all families that the third batch of Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT) have been distributed to your children and should be used twice weekly. I urge every family to ensure that each child is tested with a RAT every Monday and Thursday morning before coming to school. If your child should receive a positive result, they must be kept in home quarantine for 7 days, you must advise the school via phone or email and you must complete the online Student COIVD-19 Test portal.

Furthermore, if your child has any COVID symptoms, such as a cough, runny nose, sneezing, fever or sore throat, you must keep them home until symptoms ease. It would also be advisable to re-test them before they return to school. It is also a DET requirement that all students in Grades 3 to 6 wear a face mask while indoors, as do all school staff and visitors. I remind all families to ensure your children are coming to school with a face mask each day and are aware of the need to wear this indoors. It is also recommended by DET that children in grades Prep to 2 also wear a face mask while indoors.

Meet the Teacher Meetings

This coming <u>Tuesday 8th March</u> we will be holding our Meet the Teacher Meetings for all students in grades 1 to 6. These meetings are scheduled for 10minutes and are meant as an opportunity to build the partnership between parent and teacher to support the child's learning journey for the year ahead. It will allow you to share any aspects of your <u>We are Learners</u> / We are <u>Respectful</u> / We are <u>Safe</u> / We <u>Care</u>

child's learning needs or personality that you feel would assist the teacher in supporting your child. This is not a meeting to discuss academic progress, as it is too early in the school year.

Students in grades 1 to 6 will be dismissed at 1:30pm to accommodate meetings starting at 2pm. Bookings can be made via COMPASS (see Newsfeed for details) and all meetings will be held in the Gym. Given the current COVID Safe Restrictions, anyone attending these meetings, will be required to wear a face mask, provide evidence of vaccinations and keep social distances.

We also ask that you complete the Online Survey which was emailed directly to you during the week, before 4pm Monday.

Building Works

Many students are getting excited as they stand at the windows and watch the walls going up in the grade 1 and 2 classrooms. I have been advised that a ventilation system will now be added to provide fresh ventilation to the central common areas between the classrooms. This system will include the latest in COVID safe filters.

I must also thank all those who have made (tax deductible) contributions to our Building Fund in recent years, as these funds are now being utilised to upgrade the floor coverings in these classrooms. So, with the structural upgrades, the carpets and vinyl floors will also be upgraded with thanks to your generous contributions.

Last week a meeting was held onsite with the company who will be installing our new shade structure. It has been agreed that a large shade canopy will be installed between the Gaga Pit and the Gazebo, to facilitate our outdoor learning space. Given these DET grants have created such a high demand, our project will not be commenced until later in the year. In the interim, Sonia will be working with the Buildings, Grounds and Sustainability committee to investigate possible ground coverings and seating options for the space.

Greek Language Program

As reported earlier this year, we needed to find a teacher to take over this program from Ms Menikou. As such, we advertised the vacancy last November and while there were no applicants, we were fortunate to find Ms Nicolaou who was willing to step in to temporarily run the program. However, with great disappointment, she was not able to continue in the role and as such we are now undergoing the recruitment process again. As we go through this process, we are trying to facilitate the program with replacement staff but it is proving difficult.

There is currently a shortage state-wide of Casual Relief Teachers (CRTs), making it difficult to fill absences in classrooms let alone specialist programs. We are hoping that we will be able to recruit a Greek Language teacher in this our third attempt.

School Council Thank You for Service

As reported in the previous edition of our Newsletter, our School Council Elections were completed and the four vacancies were filled. However, with this comes the time to farewell and thank the outgoing members of School Council. As such, on behalf of the entire CWPS School Community, I wish to thank Josh Rowe (outgoing President), David Morson (outgoing Vice President) and Joshua Wolter, for their contributions and support over recent years in ensuring our school progresses in the best possible way to support all students. I know that they will all continue to be very busy with their respective careers and families but I am grateful that they will each continue to be supportive members of our School Community.

Grade 6 Camp Thank You

With the return of our Grade 6 students from Portsea Camp this afternoon, it was pleasing to see how happy they all were, despite the sleepy eyes and dragging feet. School camps are always an exciting time for the students, but they could not occur without the generous support of teaching staff. We are fortunate that we have staff members who are willing to give up three days and two nights away from their own families, to look after the safety and wellbeing of our students while on camp. I know that they too have had little sleep and been on 24-hour duty for three days, so I ask that you join me in thanking; Ms Franco, Mr Jenkins, Mr Kashani, Mr Torpey, Ms Bindloss, Ms Amerena and Mr Copping.

As the rains approach, I wish everyone a safe and comfortable fortnight ahead. I look forward to seeing many of you at our Meet the Teacher Meetings on Tuesday.





