### PARENT OPINION SURVEY – Closes Next Friday 16 September

I wish to remind all families that you have the opportunity to provide your feedback and share your views on various aspects of our school, by completing the annual Parent Opinion Survey. A <u>COMPASS email</u> went out to every family on <u>Tuesday 16 August</u>, inviting you to participate in the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey. The email contains the link and code to access the survey and **must be completed by Friday 16 September**. The information you provide goes through to the Department of Education and assists both DET and our school in determining how our school is tracking on various elements.

### **NAPLAN RESULTS ARE IN**

Earlier this week, individual NAPLAN Reports were sent home with each child in grade 3 and 5 that participated in this National Assessment Program. With our initial glance at results, we are pleased with the overall achievements our students have made. While this is only one test, on one day, it is a good opportunity to see how our students are doing in comparison to similar schools, our State and Nationally. I congratulate every student that participated, for their efforts and achievements.

### **SMILE SQUAD FREE DENTAL CHECKS**

Free dental checks will be taking place here at school early in Term 4. These are being offered as part of a State Government initiative and will be delivered by SMILE SQUAD. Your child would have come home with a large white envelope and a brown paper bag containing a sample toothpaste and toothbrush. If you wish to have your child participate and take advantage of these free checks, please complete the forms inside the envelope and return them to the school office before next Friday 16 September.

### **ENROLMENTS FOR 2023**

Last week I issued letters of offer to the families who have enrolled with us for next year and have since had a flood of emails to confirm their acceptance. This allows families to accept and confirm their place with us, which in turn enables us to begin finalising staffing requirements, grade structures and class sizes for next year. 

We have been sharing some of these stories at our weekly assemblies and you will be able to view all stories via our school website soon, look out for a Compass notification of when this is accessible.


















# with Julie Shepherd


On Friday 19<sup>th</sup> August our school was represented by two teams at the Grade 4 Maths Games Day at Lowther Hall School in Essendon.

My name is Amelia, I'm Annabelle, I'm Chiara, I'm Max and I'm Lucy and we are some of the students in the Italian Extension class this year. We would like to talk to you today about our experiences in our Italian extension class this term.

Our Italian Extension class takes place at Lunchtime every Wednesday in the Italian classroom.

We do several activities such as reading, speaking and comprehension exercises. We are learning new words all the time and how to pronounce them correctly in Italian.

An example of this is our current reading of a comic of sorts about an Italian family going to McDonalds. Sometimes whilst reading, we stop and think about the words and expressions being used, what they mean and how to pronounce them in Italian. 
