## **Dear School Community,**

Over the last fortnight it was lovely to welcome our 2024 Prep students into our classrooms, as they began their Transition Program. While we do have many existing families in the group, it was wonderful to welcome so many new families into our school community.

## **PLANNING FOR 2024**

As I reported in the last newsletter, we are currently working through the numerous 2024 planning processes. We are still finding that our enrolment numbers are changing from week to week, yet we are continuing to look at class sizes, grade structures, staffing requirements and student placements.

I know that many parents make contact at this time of year with various requests. While we will consider every request made, we do not guarantee that requests can be met.

The process of allocating a child to a class is complex, with many factors considered including academic, social and behavioural needs. We look over combinations of students and how these will work in with other combinations. While we can never guarantee that a class is perfect, we strive to make the best arrangements possible with the prior knowledge we have.

### **WORKS ACROSS OUR GROUNDS**

As many of you have noticed, we have had a lot of work happening across our school grounds already this term. I am sure you will agree that the landscaping and new outdoor settings outside the Prep and Grade 1 classrooms look wonderful. Not only will they provide excellent extensions to the learning spaces of the classrooms, but also a great space to play during recess and lunch breaks.

Work is also progressing on the outdoor learning space, with the posts in place for the shade structure and the paving for the base ready to be poured this weekend. It is pleasing to see that our students are respecting these workspaces and being safe around them.

It has been disappointing however that we have had to remove the large tree which stood over the gazebo. In preparation for the shade structure going in the arborists came to inspect the trees to organise the pruning back so that they did not interfere with the shade structure, but while doing so it was discovered that the tree had a large split down the main trunk. This proved to be a high risk of danger, one which we cannot have in our school yard. As such it was removed immediately.

In the coming weeks, there will also be works done to save and protect our Friendship Tree in the Canteen courtyard, as well as another tree in the front garden.

I am also pleased to advise that the works to reinstate our main staff toilets will commence next week.

### **CELEBRATING STUDENT ACHIEVEMENTS**

Over the last few assemblies, it has been wonderful to see and hear about students from CWPS achieving recognition for their work by external organisations. We heard (see article later in this edition) about Will and Lucas achieving amazing results for their submission for the Maths Talent Quest, both at a State and National level. Then we also had groups of students awarded for their presentations for the Science Talent Quest, while Nicole S shared her achievements at the Taekwondo National Championships in WA.

This was all topped off today with positive feedback from the swimming centre the grade 6 students have been attending this past week, about how respectful and well-mannered our students are. We have a lot to be proud of.


## **PARENT PAYMENTS STILL OPEN**

## Coburg West representing Victoria at the National Maths Talent Quest!

As some of you might already know, last week William (4K) and Lucas (3R) attended the Victorian Maths Talent Quest awards ceremony at RMIT University. These two amazing students were selected to attend this event because their project was awarded a High Distinction. The project looked into investigating the potential financial savings for Coburg West if our school were to change our current lights to a more cost efficient product. The project used high school level algebra including the creation of linear functions displaying cost over time, and the solving of a simultaneous equation to find the cost break even point in time. Will and Lucas were rewarded for all their efforts with a few surprises on the day!

- Firstly their project was selected as the Victorian Grade 4 winners of the Financial Literacy in Practice Challenge.
- Secondly, this meant the boys' project represented the state of Victoria in the **National competition**, where they received a **Highly Commended award**.

The school is hugely proud of their amazing achievement as over 400 schools and countless talented mathematicians entered the competition.



Both Lucas and Will took the time to reflect on their amazing experience.

During the Maths Talent Quest (MTQ) and Financial Literacy In Practise (FLIP) Challenge I learnt a lot, for while making our project we had to do sums over decimals, how maths can help the environment and most importantly how to use algebra. On the awards day it was exciting to be there and to so what everyone else did. There were some very interesting topics including, starting a business and baking food and the expenses.




