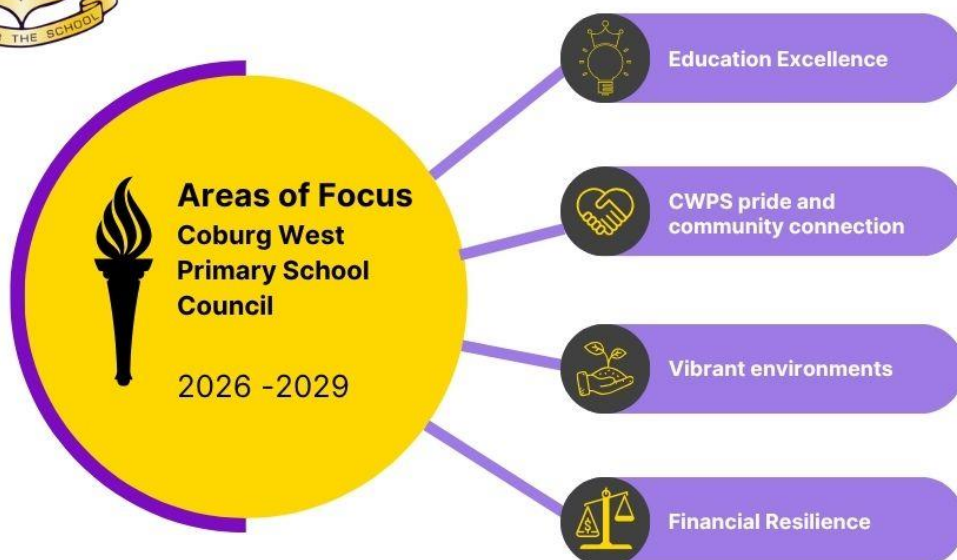

Maths Fluency – The Importance of Learning Maths Facts!

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

An essential part of the Mathematics Victorian Curriculum 2.0 is that students learn and develop their automatic maths facts in the 4 processes. This allows students to “free up” their working memory so that more complex problems can be solved. Knowing fluency facts is a vital indicator for future success. Students need to learn one multiplication table at a time then develop speed and accuracy once learnt.

By the end of Grade 2 the aim is that students have all their addition and subtraction facts to 20. 2's, 5's and 10's tables maybe started. Grade 3 requires 1 to 5 facts inclusive and 10 facts By the end of Grade 4 the aim is all students know all their multiplication and division facts to 100. Any larger facts learnt, such as the 11s and 12s, are a bonus.

The Coburg West website under Curriculum for Maths Home Learning has many revision flashcards and sheets to support parents and students in learning all Maths facts. Here is the link- [Maths Home Learning- Fact Fluency](#) Fact fluency sheets can be printed or done orally with support. Ask your child's teacher if you need help.

Numeracy Update.

This Education Report focuses on the school's approach to improving student results in Numeracy. We are clearly doing a fantastic job in our Early Years grades as this year's NAPLAN Grade 3 shows that 88% of our kids are Strong or Exceeding in their Numeracy proficiency – well above schools in our Network 70% and most importantly 6% above similar schools (with a comparable demographic)

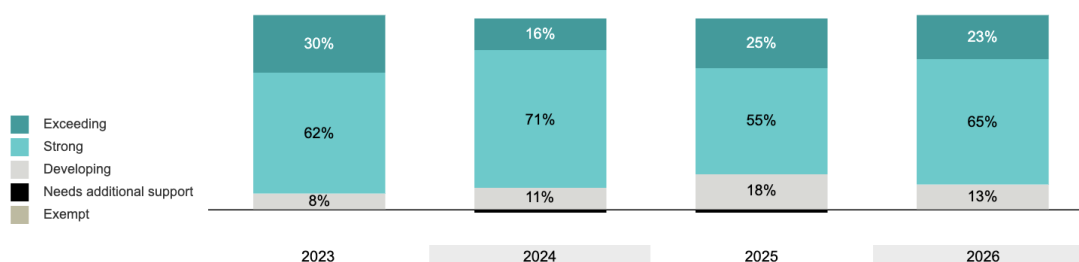

We are particularly proud of the fact that the Mean Scaled score has risen over the past two years encompassing the period when we changed to the Victorian Curriculum 2.0 which meant that a lot of content needed to be taught in different age groups. Impressively, there are no students in the “Needs Additional Support” category this year. Parents and carers may have noticed on student reports only one grade is given for all areas of Mathematics where previously we assessed achievement against Number and Algebra, Statistics and Probability and Measurement and Geometry.

When we look at the trend in our Grade 5 results, we can see that the same level of 88% of students in Strong or Achieving proficiency has been maintained as well as a very impressive trend of Mean scaled scores improving each year from 2024. This reaffirms our belief that we are working with the right balance of knowledge retrieval and practical application to maintain high standards so that students are improving at their own level.

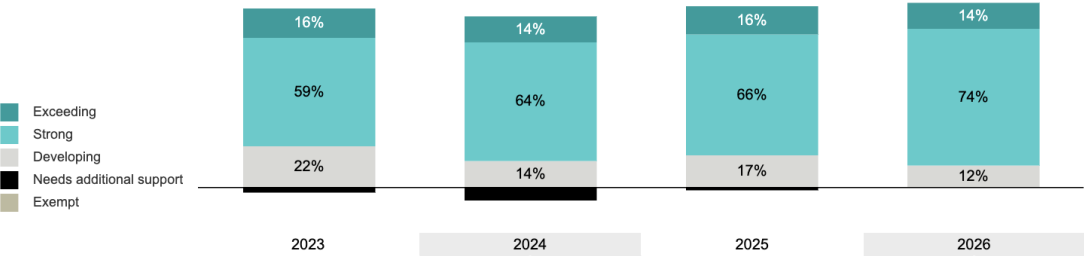

Whilst we recognise that the school’s NAPLAN results are excellent, they are not the be all and end of maths improvement measures and we have developed very useful learning sequences for every concept taught in maths. Fiona Currie and her Mathematics Curriculum committee have worked incredibly hard to create what we call “I-Can” statements which break the learning sequence down into child friendly language that students can use when setting individual goals in maths and see where their learning fits into a continuum. In other words, they are not all expected to complete Grade 1 Maths targets in Grade 1 but they are challenged at their point of need. All assessment tasks are in the process of being updated to match the new Vic Curric 2.0 and if anything, we are finding more and more of our students are exceeding expected levels of attainment. Staff are planning three and sometimes four levels to differentiate the learning and challenge their learners.

Fair isn't everybody getting the same thing.

Fair is everybody getting what they need to be successful.

We have been trialling an online assessment platform called the Digital Assessment Library to provide instantly accurate information to teachers as to which specific areas students have mastered, and which need further work. This informs their planning to make sure that set tasks are individualised and challenging.

We have always looked for ways to extend and support our learners at Coburg West. The Grade 4 Maths extension group meet every Wednesday for challenging tasks with Fiona Currie and the CLIP (Challenge Learning in Projects) is led by Corey Robinson to extend students' thinking. This term the Grade 5 and 6 CLIP students are linking physical measurement to coding and robotics to ensure that application of mathematics concepts is both hands on and engaging.

Our LNEIP (Literacy and Numeracy Early Intervention Program) will focus on students in Grades 1, 2 and 3 for Semester 2, 2026 to make sure that students who aren't demonstrating expected levels of growth are given small group intervention to target the retention and recall of maths concepts. Fiona has five groups twice a week working on Individual needs to catch up with their peers as they refresh their knowledge of vocabulary, improve conceptual knowledge and practise repetitive retrieval to bridge the gap.

To fully extend and engage our learners we provide opportunities to join competitions like the Maths Talent Quest and Coding challenges. We aim to embed the Victorian Lesson Plans – gleaning off the best bits to suit our learners. Staff are using retrieval resources to support the knowledge and memory and retention and recall of students. Teachers always explore problem solving application tasks within the teaching of each concept. We're so lucky to have someone with Fiona Currie's level of expertise, mentoring and coaching teachers to always make maths lessons engaging.

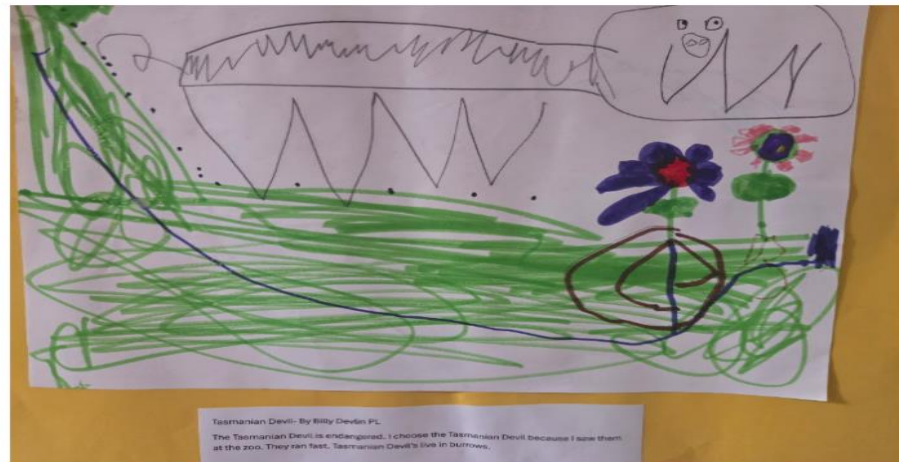
