
PARENT PAYMENTS

I wish to remind families who have not yet done so, that it is not too late to make your voluntary contributions for this 2022 school year. Unfortunately, at this stage of the year, only 61% of families have made these payments which is more than 20% down on this time last year. These payments can be made via the COMPASS App and will cover costs incurred by our school to provide the **essential learning items** your children utilise to complete their daily learning tasks (eg pencil, paper and other stationary items, art supplies and sport equipment), as well as keeping our school nurse engaged to provide the daily care and support for the numerous children visiting First Aid each day.






























CWPS Community Group News

Rochelle has a Master's Degree in Counselling from Monash University. She is a Level 2 Member of the Australian Counselling Association and has clinical experience in primary and secondary school settings.

Rochelle has a passion for working with children and young people as she finds importance in protecting their welfare. She does this by working together with them in enhancing their well-being so that young people can lead flourishing lives both in school, at home, and in the community.

Her work focuses on childhood trauma, mental health issues, family and/or social stresses, sexuality, self-esteem, self-harm, self-discovery and coping with stress. In her counselling sessions, Rochelle uses therapeutic modalities such as Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), Person-Centred Therapy (PCT), Cognitive and Behavioural Therapy (CBT), Art and Play Therapy, and Mindfulness Therapy.

Rochelle believes in engaging with family/household members to create a long-lasting therapeutic environment for her clients even outside of her sessions. She believes in a relational and collaborative approach to therapy while being mindful of cultural, ethnic, and economic concerns. She works to identify all aspects of an individual's life that impacts their well-being including their physical health, social supports, work or school environment, and faith/spirituality in this process.


