absence there were some ups and downs, but I am grateful for the way they and the staff worked through it all. I am also grateful for the ongoing support our school community provides. We are very fortunate here at CWPS.

Enrolments and Transitions

While our 2026 enrolments are still open, our Prep Transition program has begun. This past week, we had our Buddy Session, where the new students visited the Prep classrooms and engaged in a variety of activities being led by our Grade Three students. It was wonderful to see how well our Grade Three students interacted and started forming friendships with the younger students. Given they will be officially paired as Buddies when the new school year starts, it was nice to see that good connections were being formed and leadership skills already being demonstrated.

In the coming weeks, some of our Grade Five students will also have a similar opportunity with visits to a local Kindergarten to lead the little ones through various sports activities.

Likewise, if you are planning to move your child/ren to another primary school please notify the office in writing as soon as possible. This will not only assist us in our forecasting and planning for the 2026 school year, but it will also assist the office team in managing your child's transfer between schools.

Gr P-2 Tabloid Sport Morning

Our first week back at school ended with a fun morning of Tabloid Sports for all students in grades Prep to two. While it may have been a windy morning, it was filled with fun and excitement as students worked in mixed age groups, moving through numerous sporting events. A big congratulations to our Grade Six Leaders who lead the groups through all the events and showed great skill in managing the groups, demonstrating and encouraging the younger students through each activity. Thank you to Mr Harvey for organising this fun filled morning and to all the parents who came along to support.

Choir Performance at Italian Festa

This Sunday(19th), our school choir had the opportunity to perform at the Italian Festa held at the Royal Melbourne Exhibition Buildings in Carlton. They were one of five schools selected to participate on Sunday in the second edition of the Zecchino d'Oro in Melbourne. An Italian children's song was selected for the choir to sing and perform in front of the audience. While I might be biased, our choir did an amazing job and certainly entertained everyone. I wish to congratulate every member of the CWPS Choir, Mina who leads the choir, Ms Sommers who got us involved and led the choir throughout and all the staff and families who came along to support and cheer for our kids.



Works Almost Complete

While there has been a range of works happening across our school for a good part of this year, it is almost coming to an end. We have started this term with limited access across our courtyard, as the screening is being installed along our upper walkways and bridges. While this may be an inconvenience, we are grateful this important work is being undertaken to help ensure the ongoing safety of our students. This work is due to be completed and cleared by the end of the coming week.

Also, resin was injected under the eastern tower over the holidays to support and lift the foundations. While there were some unexpected complications, the last of these will be dealt with in the coming weeks when the ground cover will be repaired and levelled out, so the temporary fencing can then be removed. The last stage of this project will take place early next year, when they will repair the cracks and internal plaster work in the eastern tower.

I must commend our students who have managed so well and respected everyone's safety as they avoid these work areas. Thank you also to our staff and families who have shown great patience as we get through these works.

Voluntary Contributions

After years of keeping CWPS buzzing with events, our Community Group Office Bearers will finish up at the end of 2025.


