I was able to enjoy my travels through Malta, Greece, Turkey and Italy because I knew the school was in the good hands of Mr Copping and Ms Amerena who were willing to step up in my absence. I am grateful to them both for leading our school through to the end of term 3.

#### **CONGRATULATIONS AND THANK YOU**

So much has happened in my absence:

- Well done to Ms Amerena on the great success of the Writers Festival and to all the children who submitted pieces for display and judging.
- Congratulations to Betsy and the Community Group for yet another wonderful family day out at the Shore Reserve Showdown, and further congratulations to the team of parents who battled it out to bring back the Golden Boot.
- A huge thank you to Sonia and the Buildings, Grounds and Sustainability group for the work gone into
  the improvements outside our Prep and Grade 1 classrooms. I am sure you will all agree that the
  decking, landscaping, and outdoors furniture make for some unique spaces for our children to learn
  and play. But also, a thank you to all the families who support our fundraising efforts through the year,
  as this is how we can fund such improvements.

#### **PLANNING FOR 2024**

As we commence this term, our planning for the new school year gets into full swing. I am working closely with Admin, Leadership, and staff as there is still a lot to sort through regarding staffing needs (both teaching and Educational Support), grade structures (how many classes) and what specialist/support programs we are able to offer, all of which is determined by the finances available.

A lot has changed across our community in recent years, and this is having an impact on our financial position. With a decrease in enrolments, a drop in school-based revenue, and an increase in expenses, we too are needing to make some changes as a school. I will endeavour to keep you all informed once we are able to confirm our plans.

Therefore, it is extremely important that if you or someone you know that lives within our school zone have not yet enrolled for 2024, please do so as soon as possible. Likewise, if you intend to move your child to another school to complete their primary school years, please notify our office as soon as possible.

Meanwhile, our Transition Program begins next week, and we're excited to welcome our 2024 Prep cohort and the new families joining our school community.

#### PARENT PAYMENTS STILL OPEN

One way families can continue to support our school is by making the voluntary contributions for 2023. These Parent Payments help cover the cost of all supplies and materials used by the children in their learning throughout the year. While this includes their daily use of stationery items such as pencils, glue, and paper, it also covers the costs of art supplies, maths or science resources and reading materials.

With less than 60% of families having already made these payments, please be reminded that payments can still be made via the COMPASS App or directly at the Office.

#### **PARENT OPINION SURVEY**

This survey closed in my absence and results are now available. Having sent out 211 invites, we had a response rate of 11%, with a total of 32 parents completing the survey.

Some areas for improvement across our school are based around not enough communication from teachers about their child's progress, teachers not providing useful feedback/responding to the learning needs of their child, and children not being taught organisational skills to manage school/homework.

Pleasingly, some of the areas parents feel that our school is exceeding in include:

- My child feels accepted by other students at school.
- This school provides opportunities for my child to develop a sense of responsibility.
- The school gives me opportunities to participate in my child's education.
- I feel this school values parent/caregiver/guardian contributions.

#### **COLOUR RUN SUCCESS**

A huge shout out to Mr Torpey, Mr Peric and Mr Harvey for their hard work in organising the whole school Colour Run Fundraiser event held last week. This fundraiser supporting the Alannah and Madeline Foundation was initiated by students and siblings, Estelle and Marcus who also worked hard in helping organise and promote this event. While I was very disappointed to be struck down by illness and not be able to attend, I am pleased that a fun day was had by all. It's also pleasing to hear that the total funds raised by our school has grown. Another thank you to Siddhesh, a parent from our school, who took some amazing photos on the day and has shared them with us.

While I am sure this final school term will fly by, I wish you all a great fortnight ahead.

- Last term's National Day of Action Against Bullying. How our school is making connections, promoting caring for others, and standing against bullying.

Welcome to Term 4!

Spring is here and we all started back at school fresh a week ago. Was it only a week ago? 😊



Teachers and students are already busy and getting back to work quickly. Term 4 is a busy term at CWPS, and it is important that both teachers and students are looking after their mental health and wellbeing in what is a busy 12week term in the lead up to Christmas. It also will involve teachers giving student assessments and report writing to a deadline. Both tasks that can be a source of anxiety for both students and teachers.

#### **Self-Care For Students and Teachers**

This week we (Dan, Matt, and I) gave a presentation to staff on Self Care, in preparation for the term ahead. In counselling, building connections and having people that you love and spend time, with are called 'Protective Factors.' Having close friends and family would be protective factors. These factors help protect you as an individual from mental health issues arising and spending time with friends and family are also important as part of self-care. In fact, making connections has been shown to prevent mental health issues.

#### Why feeling connected to school matters

Feeling a connection to school is correlated with positive health and academic outcomes and is linked to positive emotional wellbeing including a reduction in levels of anxiety (Baumeister & Leary 1995). In addition, students with low levels of connectedness to school are more at risk of poor health and wellbeing and a higher risk of anxiety, depression, and low academic outcomes. Nurturing positive relationships between your child and their school really does matter, for their health and wellbeing, their mental health, their sense of belonging and their future.

#### The National Day of Action Against Bullying

The National Day of Action Against Bullying was held on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> August and both teachers and students worked hard to make the week in the lead up to it, impactful, educational and a lot of fun!

After meeting with the Wellbeing Team, we decided that the best way to promote it within the school was to work with the Year 6 students to reward students who were demonstrating positivity and inclusiveness towards others. The Year 6s devised a positive reward system to give book-marks for those caught being good in the yard and helping others. Grade levels across the school, worked on creating buddy activities that nurtured a sense of connectedness between different year levels and had a great time doing so! 
