Coburg West Primary School Outside of School Hours Care (OSHC) cultivates an environment of experiential learning, personal growth and interpersonal development that is meaningful to each child. It is through a holistic lens that OSHC centres children as key stake holders in decision making processes that affect their lives and time throughout the program. Children provide collaborative input and direction with Educators throughout program operation, both indoors and outdoors, and are recognised as capable co-creators of the OSHC environment and experiences within.

OSHC Educators work to establish a program that designs and delivers quality opportunities for physical, social, emotional and cognitive development. Social harmony and skill development is an expressed value among the OSHC children, and is facilitated by Educators through rapport building, role modelling, guidance and open dialog with children as autonomous individuals. Building positive rapport with children works to supports a child's sense of comfort and belonging, whilst scaffolding a common ground that is championed by mutual respect and preservation of dignity. Guided by the My Time, Our Place framework, Educators practice critical, reflexive evaluations of their contributions and practice as a committed effort to the standard of education and care upheld by program more broadly.

Maintaining a child safe environment is paramount within the service.

OSHC educators complete mandatory training in protecting children, and work in adherence with rigorous child safety policies and procedures- that which assert the Child Safe Standards. Throughout all aspects, the OSHC service functions in manner that safeguards and actions children's rights, health and dimensions of safety.

OSHC's devotion to the interests and needs of children and their families nurtures the program in such a way that allows a community to flourish.

The educational program is emboldened by recognition of and connection to diversity among OSHC's families. Culture is celebrated though activity-based learning experiences, group discussions, participation in significant cultural dates and displays throughout the physical service environment.

Acknowledging Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and Country is a key principle and daily practice of OSHC, and one that we hold to be an all- inclusive effort to honour.

Children are active participants in Acknowledging Country, learning, and connecting to culture with genuineness and in pursuit of reconciliation.

Having regard and practicing care for the natural world is an important propensity of the OSHC service. Engaging with environmentally sustainable practices while promoting a curiosity for, and ingenuity to advocate for the world around them supports children to become agents for change and to create a future that they want to live in.

As a welcoming space for children to play, feel respected and be safe, OSHC fosters peer connections, bolsters opportunities for both direct and experiential learning, and is shaped by community. Continuity of values and intentions facilitates extended learning and builds upon children's abilities. OSHC individualises guidance for each child so that they may develop in a way that is personal to them, enabling children actualise their own potential.


A range of activities were facilitated throughout Reconciliation Week in reflection of this years theme. Namely, children participated in;

OUR NEW PETS AT OSHC


